Board of Education Meeting Notes, February 12, 2024

<u>Superintendent Kurt Krizan's Updates/Points of Pride:</u> Mr. Krizan shared updated renderings of some of the proposed building improvements from Hoffman, Planning, Design and Construction including the childcare center at Hillcrest, the auditorium, Tech Ed Department and collaboration spaces at the high school. Information Items:

Finance & Facilities Committee Update - John Arens reported on accepting bids on a plow truck and a district van, Middle School roof area #9 and an air handler at Olga Brener in need of repair. High School completed gym floor replacement which is covered under warranty and the assessment of the Middle School gym floor. The safety bucket project will be completed upon receipt of the one item we are waiting on. Bobbi Lemerond reported on the finance area, unallocated ESSER funds and purchase of additional security cameras district wide.

Action Items:

Cameras - Eric Bruner, Director of Information Technology, presented proposal to add additional cameras. Ben Brazeau, Instructional Technology Coordinator, stated that further investigation revealed needs for additional cameras. Quote for cameras last year covered the high school only. Wire Tech would run wiring and placement. Board approved.

Interactive Flat Panels - Ben Brazeau proposed the purchase of 80 interactive flat panels at Olga Brener and Hillcrest. The upgraded technology project would include installation of new & removal of old equipment. Group approach to install equipment and train staff. Jeremy Hodkiewicz, Tech Ed teacher, demonstrated the smart panel. Greg Brown, Tech Ed teacher, discussed using in classroom instruction. Timeline to install would be scheduled around teacher schedules and completed by the end of the school year. Board approved the purchase as proposed.

Collection Agency Search - Cory Kaisler, Data Systems Coordinator, presented a recommendation to contract with a collection agency to assist in recovering unpaid fees including but not limited to, athletic fees, device damage and lunch accounts. The Board approved utilizing a collections agency to recover unpaid fees.

Education for Employment (ACP) Plan - Matt Raduechel, SCHS Principal and Elisha Wagenson, Director of Instruction & Personalized Learning, requested approval of the proposed ACP plan presented in January. Board approved the ACP plan as presented.



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Title VI Student College Visits Trip - Joel Doxtator, Tribal Liaison for SCHS, shared that Title VI has a grant for \$3000 to take 20 SSD students along with 20 Menominee Indian School District students to visit UW campuses: Eau Claire, Stout, River Falls and LaCrosse over two days. Students would include juniors and seniors, with passing grades, in good standing, approved in advance. Students will also raise money on their own from fundraisers. 16 students are currently signed up. The goal of the trip is to introduce students to post secondary universities/college opportunities. The board approved the overnight trip as presented.
