It's essential to ensure that we maintain effective communication between home and school. I would like to remind everyone of the importance of keeping us informed about any updates or changes that may affect your child's school day. This includes but not limited to:

**Medication Changes:** If there have been any changes in your child's medication, dosage, or administration times, please notify the school nurse. Your prompt communication helps us ensure your child's well-being and safety while they are in our care.

**Dismissal/Pickup:** Any modifications to your child's regular dismissal routine, such as a change in the person responsible for pickup or a different after-school arrangement, should be communicated to the school office in advance. This ensures a smooth and secure transition for your child at the end of the day.

**Pertinent Information:** If there are any other updates or pertinent information that you believe would be important for us to know, such as changes in contact details, address, phone numbers, family circumstances, or health concerns, please do not hesitate to share that information with us.

Attendance and Being on Time: It is important that students attend school everyday. If your child is complaining of not "feeling well" and has no fever, send them to school. We will always send sick children home if they have a fever or vomiting. Also, we have around 25 students arrive to school late. If you want your child to eat breakfast they need to arrive at 7:35. They must be in their seats (not walking in the front door) no later than 7:55. Please help with this. We want our students to learn that you've got to show up and be on time when you have a job. At this time of their life school is their job. We want them to be successful in every way!

Your proactive communication allows us to provide the best possible support and care for your child during their time at school. We are committed to creating a safe, nurturing, and conducive learning environment for all our students.


Should you have any questions, concerns, or need further assistance, please feel free to reach out to our staff. We are here to listen, collaborate, and ensure a positive educational experience for your child.

#### **CogAT Testing**

CogAT Testing for grades K, 2, 4 and 6 will be February 5 through February 23. The Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) is a multiple-choice K-12 assessment that measures reasoning skills. The CogAT Test measures the level and pattern of cognitive development of a student compared to students at their age and grade. These general reasoning abilities, which start developing at birth and continue through early adulthood, are influenced by experiences gained both in and out of school. It is used by teachers to identify a student's strengths and weaknesses and help guide guide educational placement decisions.
