## What is Title I?

Folkston Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards and reinforcing and enhancing efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family

engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with all parents and family members, a written family engagement plan.



## School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

### What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Folkston Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Folkston Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Folkston Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



### How is it revised?

Folkston Elementary School welcomes parent input and comments at any time to review and revise this family-school partnership plan, as well as our school-parent compact and the family-school partnership budget. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view. Ongoing efforts will be made to solicit input from parents and community members throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey at the end of the year to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement. Parents can also give feedback during any of our Family Fun Events through evaluations.

### Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Folkston Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, parents of migratory children, and parents of homeless students.

### Where is it available?

All students receive a copy of this plan with their first report card. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

### ***2023–24 District Goals***

- Increase the percentage of students designated as developing or higher on the ELA GMAS from 91% to 93% in 2023.
- Increase the percentage of students designated as developing or higher on the Math GMAS from 93% to 95% in 2023.

### ***2023–24 School Goals***

- To improve early literacy skills for all students in grades K-4, as measured by comparison data from Acadience.
- To move 10% of students from Beginning, & Developing to the next level on the ELA GMAS, while moving 5% of student from Proficient to Exceeds.
- To move 10% of students from Beginning, & Developing to the next level, while moving 5% of student from Proficient to Exceeds in Math GMAS.
- To decrease number of office referrals for Level 3 and 4 offenses by 10% in FY24.
- To decrease number of students who have five or more unexcused absent days in FY24.

### ***School – Parent Compacts***

As part of this plan, Folkston Elementary and our families have developed a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The

compacts are reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the school year. The school- parent compacts are kept with each child's teacher if parents need a copy.

#### ***Bingo for Books –Spring 2024***


Bingo for Books will be an opportunity for parents to come out and play bingo with their students and win books.

- Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published to include all students, not excluding those who are limited English proficient, disabled migratory, homeless, economically disadvantaged or those in need of additional academic assistance and posted on the school website and included in the monthly school newsletter for all parents.
- Conduct staff development each quarter on parent engagement practices and effective strategies for staff to communicate and build partnerships with parents.
- Partner with private and federally funded Pre-Kindergarten children, the local middle and high school to share school information about parent engagement activities that will help prepare parents and their child for kindergarten and improve school transition.
- Share information in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities, such as phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parental engagement.
- Provide necessary materials for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- Collaborate with community leaders and business groups to increase participation and awareness of the school parental engagement plan and activities.
- Offer parent classes to help further enhance their child's various education backgrounds.
- Listen and respond to parents' requests for additional support for parental engagement activities.
