Exciting things are happening in the Nashwauk-Keewatin School District! We've had several opportunities to celebrate the greatness that is our district this past month. We were also able to celebrate the accomplishment of Carole McBride who graduated from Nashwauk High School in 1961, but did not receive a diploma because she lacked a physical education credit. Her disability made it difficult to participate in the gym class. It was an honor to be part of the celebration and see the joy it brought to Carole's family.

On the topic of our new school and community wellness center, I have some exciting news to share. Last week the Iron Range Resources & Rehabilitation Board (IRRRB) approved a \$5.4 million dollar grant to help cover increased costs for the project due to inflation and the demolition of our existing school buildings.

Before this grant, the construction management team had planned several measures to reduce costs and keep the project under budget. These cuts included fewer energy efficient windows, no enclosures for rooftop HVAC units, and reduced square footage for our future technical education space. This grant will allow us to add these features back into the construction plan to provide the best learning environment possible for our students.

I am so grateful to the IRRRB for generously recognizing the importance of our new school to the health of our region. Many thanks also to our school board vice chair, Barb Kalmi, and our construction manager, ICS, who were instrumental in our efforts to win this grant and manage the challenges of rising costs.

I'm happy to report that construction on the project continues to progress quickly. The walls for the gymnasium and technical education areas are already up, and I am told the high school and elementary wings will soon follow. Work on the walls will continue for some time, in addition to ongoing installation of underground utilities, steel support beams, and the frame of the gymnasium ceiling.
