Carpool reminders

Thank you for your smiles and patience as you become accustomed to our carpool process. Please keep the following in mind to make it even more efficient, with safety as our top priority:

- In the morning, all parents are encouraged to use the carpool lanes vs. parking in the lot and walking children to the entrance. For safety reasons, Elementary children may not be dropped off in either parking lot by themselves.
- As you wait in the carpool lanes, take care not to block parking lot entrances/exits, as students, staff and other parents may be coming and going.

- In the afternoon, parents of high school students are encouraged to use the parking lot for pickup vs. going through the carpool lane.
 Park in a marked space vs. idling in the lot.
- When exiting at the front of the building, please do not cut through the parking lot to use it as an exit, as this can create a safety hazard.
- Please observe the posted speed limit on school grounds and watch for pedestrians.

With everyone's cooperation and understanding, we can continue to keep carpool smooth, efficient and safe for all. Carpool procedures are attached to this newsletter for your convenience.

Procedures for absences and late arrivals

The school day begins at 8:05 for Junior High and High School students and 8:15 am for Kindergarten and Elementary. Students should arrive at least five minutes in advance of their start time in order to get to class on time. If you arrive late, Elementary parents are asked to sign their children in at the office so that we can give them a late pass. Secondary students should stop in to the Secondary office for a pass; if a parent wishes to excuse a late arrival, they should call the

office at the number listed below. If your child(ren) will be absent from school, please call the office (Elementary: 995-0665 or Secondary: 932-6038) as soon as possible to let us know. Feel free to leave a voicemail message. Parents will be called to verify any absences that have not been called in. Thank you for your assistance in ensuring the safety of students at Grand Traverse Academy.

Elementary Band and Elementary & Mustang Choir information

Beginning Band. All students in the 5th & 6th grades



have the opportunity to join the Beginning Band. Students must have their instrument and the Standard of Excellence – Enhanced Edition music book by **Monday, September 18**.

Elementary Choir. Students in the 4th and 5th grades who are interested in joining the Elementary Choir must turn in a permission slip by **Wednesday, September 13**. Auditions for new members will take place on Friday, September 15. Returning members need not audition but do need a permission slip. Rehearsals begin on Monday, September 18 and continue on Mondays and Wednesdays from 7:40-8:10 am.

Mustang Choir. Students in grades 6-8 may join the Mustang Choir, with no audition necessary. A permission slip is required by **Friday, September 15.** Rehearsals begin on Tuesday, September 19 and continue on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 7:30-8:00 am.

Fill the Pantry Jeans Day planned

Did you know that GTA has a food pantry? The purpose



is to provide lunches for less fortunate students (and those who occasionally forget to bring their school

lunch). It's time to fill it up for the quarter and we welcome your help. On **Thursday, September 14**, we're holding our first of five Fill the Pantry Jeans Days for all students and staff. School-appropriate jeans (no holes, rips or legging style) may be worn with uniform tops in exchange for a \$2 per person donation. We thank you for your assistance, which is always voluntary.

Authorization needed for all medication

As we begin the new school year, please know that



according to state law, we must have a physician's authorization in order to administer prescription medication to your children at school, and a parent's authorization for overthe-counter medications

(including herbal homeopathic remedies). The only exception is over-the-counter cough drops, which students may carry with them at school as needed.

Authorization forms are available in either office and can be faxed to and from the doctor's office if necessary. Completed forms should be dropped off in the office by a parent, along with the labeled medication. Thank you for your understanding.

Box Tops for Education. Box Tops for Education offers






a way to support our school with the purchase of many grocery items: The <u>Box Tops</u> mobile app allows you to scan

What do I do with this?

Elementary parents received a card that looks like this



in Open House packets last week. They were also available for Secondary parents. If you are new to GTA. this is what we use to quickly and safely identify which students may be picked up by which car in the afternoon carpool line. Add your youngest student's first and last name and the name of their

teacher (for Elementary students only), cut at the dotted lines and hang from your rear-view mirror when you arrive for pick-up. Additional or replacement tags are available in the offices.

Safe driving clinics available for teens

NWEA testing next week

Students in grades 7-10 will be administered the NWEA tests in math and reading during their math and English language arts classes on Monday and Tuesday of next week. NWEA tests measure growth and proficiency in school subject matter and provide insights to help with instruction. Be sure that students arrive at school promptly to avoid any possible delays or disruptions in testing.

Online payments available on GTA website

Parents are encouraged to use our convenient and secure <u>Pay Online feature</u> on the GTA website to purchase milk passes, pay athletics and materials fees, preschool tuition, Quality Care fees and more! Note that if you add an item to your bag and change your mind, you must continue to the checkout page to remove it from the shopping cart. Likewise, if you want to add another item to your bag, you must do so from the checkout page as well.

BATA Route 31 returns

Hello 5th and 6th Grade Parents,

Welcome back to another exciting year for our Grand Traverse Academy band program! If your child was in the band last year we know that they are eager to continue participating. If you are brand new to our school this year and missed the opportunity to be fitted for an instrument, we would like to extend an invitation to your son/daughter to join the Elementary Band for the 2023-24 school year. All students in 5th and 6th grades have the opportunity to join the band at GTA.

We recommend that families consider renting an instrument from Marshall Music to help ensure that students are able to learn to play with a quality functional instrument. Instrument rental costs range from \$30-\$85 a month, depending on the instrument. More information about Marshall Music's rental program can be found on their website at www.marshallmusic.com/rentals. This program is rent-to-own, so each monthly payment is applied to the total cost of purchasing the instrument. If you decide to purchase a used instrument, it is wise to have it inspected by Marshall Music so that any repairs can be made before school starts.

Be aware that instruments that you find in "big box" stores and stores that are not music stores are not acceptable band instruments. In addition, any instrument that is green, blue, purple, red, or any other color other than natural metal or wood colors are frustrating for beginners because they were not designed to last. Also, if you find an instrument on eBay or the internet, please call or email one of us so we can help advise you on brands. Many of the inexpensive models on the internet are advertised as real student instruments; however, they do not work for students.

Students must have a band instrument and <u>Standard of Excellence Book 1</u> by Monday September 18, 2023 in order to participate in the 2023-2024 Elementary Band program. Marshall Music will be delivering all rental instruments to the school and we will pass them out to students beginning on September 18, 2023 during their band class.

Please consider your options for an instrument and financially plan for it. We have just a few school owned instruments available in cases of financial hardship. However, we encourage families to work with their children and find areas to cut back to make purchasing an instrument possible. When a child is willing to work or sacrifice for it, they will usually take the privilege more seriously and you'll see great results!

Advanced Band students will need their instrument on the first day of band for their class.

Check with their teacher for the band schedule.
