Subscribe now and save 25 percent on the first month! To redeem, create an account, and then go to the Subscribe page. Regular rates apply after the first month.

## Concert streaming available

Although we encourage families to attend school concerts in person for the best experience, we are excited to be trying out a live streaming option for band and choir concerts with the NFHS Network, our new athletic event broadcast tool. If you have purchased a subscription (see previous story), simply log in, choose Grand Traverse Academy in the search bar at the upper left and click the LIVE tab under the Search Results. The concert will begin broadcasting at the scheduled time. The good news is that non-athletic events may be viewed live without a paid subscription! If you or a family member or friend would like to watch either concert from home, visit the NFHS Network and follow these steps:

1. Complete the Create Your Account section.
2. Type Grand Traverse Academy in the search box at the upper left of the screen.
3. The concert will begin broadcasting at the scheduled time.

We hope you'll bear with us during these first live stream events and excuse any unforeseen audio or video issues that may occur. We look forward to utilizing this network for other non-athletic events in the future.
