

Broken Crayons Still Melt

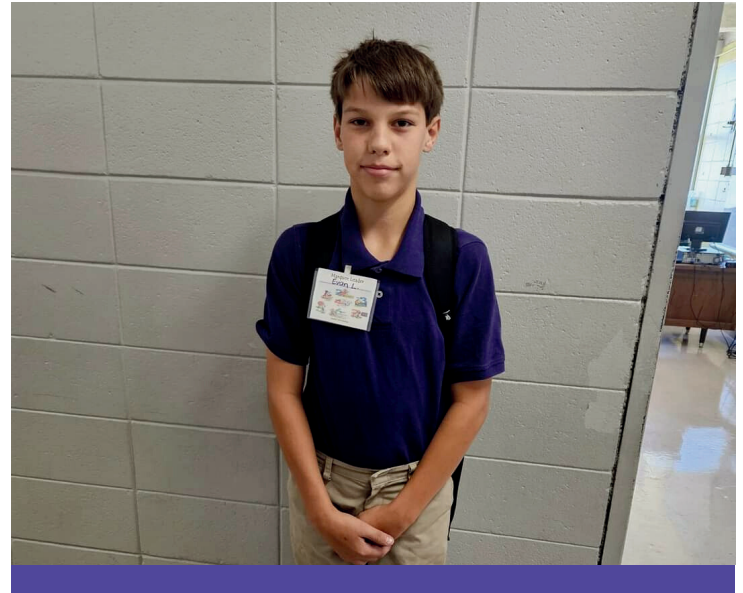
