Early Head Start offers child development services to pregnant mothers and families with infants and young children birth to age three. The home-based program supports children and their families through weekly home visits and group socialization activities held twice a month. The home visits provide individualized, comprehensive services to support and strengthen the relationships between infants, toddlers, and their parents. Families must meet income eligibility requirements.

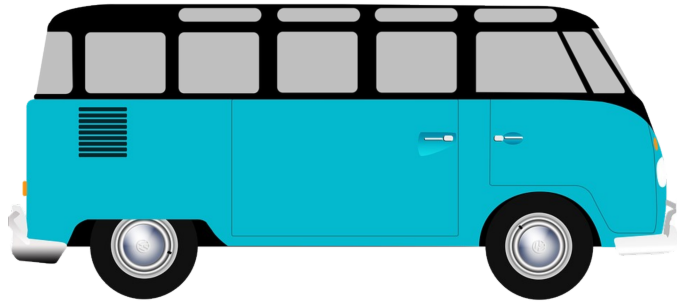
