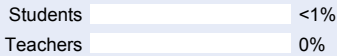

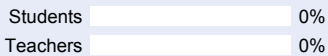

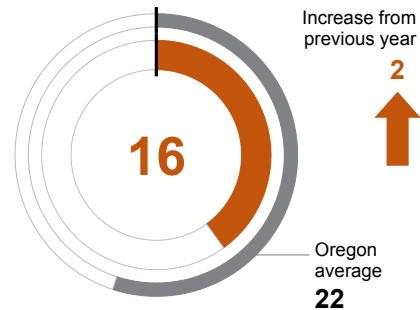

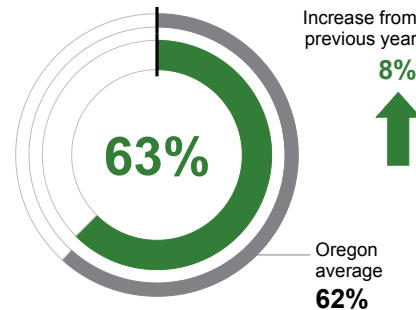
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

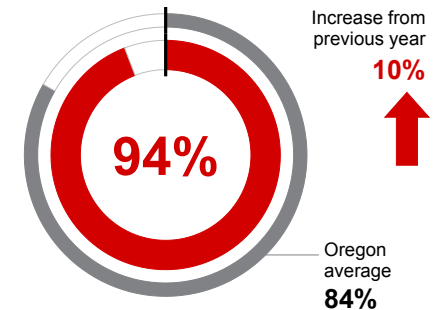
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

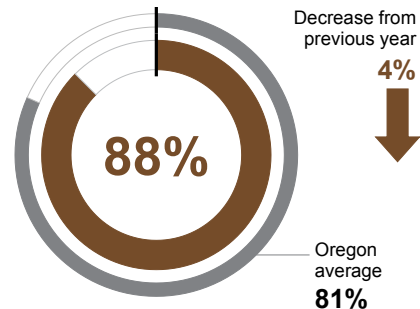
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

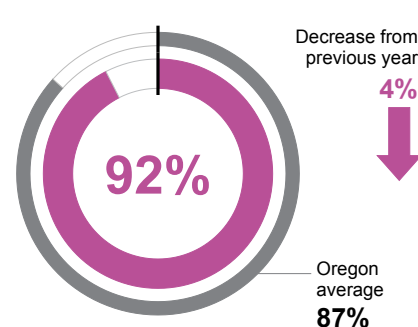
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



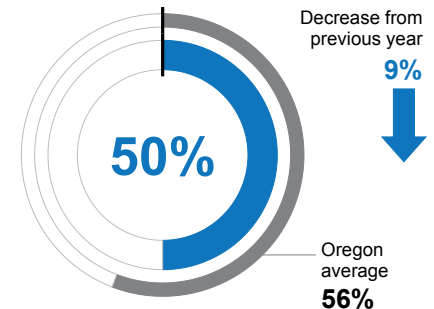
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

The Sherman County School District Board has established goals to: increase student achievement at all levels through a focus on reading, writing, math & science; provide support for expanded opportunities for students to graduate from high school prepared for post-secondary education & training; provide enhanced professional development for staff with implementation of Response to Intervention & Positive Behavioral Intervention & Supports; implement the Board-adopted safety initiative; and be more intentional with communication to increase parent and community involvement as partners in the education of their students.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

The safety and well-being of our students and staff is a top priority of the Sherman County School District. In conjunction with our multi-agency safety committee, we pursue a multiphase approach to safety planning by creating meaningful, thoughtful, coordinated, and aligned systems and procedures consistent with best practices. The District has implemented numerous safety measures that are designed to support the academic, social, and emotional needs of our students while maintaining a safe and orderly learning environment.
