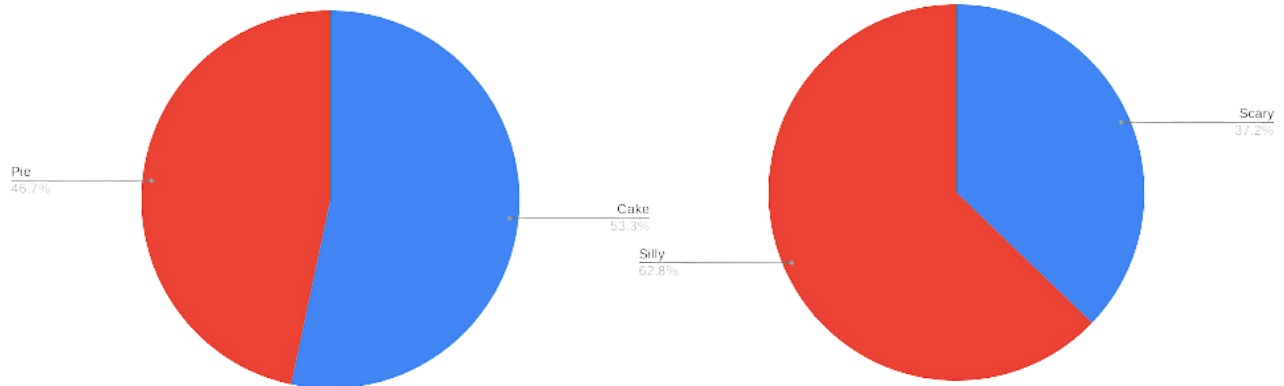

With football ending that means basketball season is approaching. The Junior high kids started Basketball October 9th. Their first game is on October 27th against Richey Lambert.

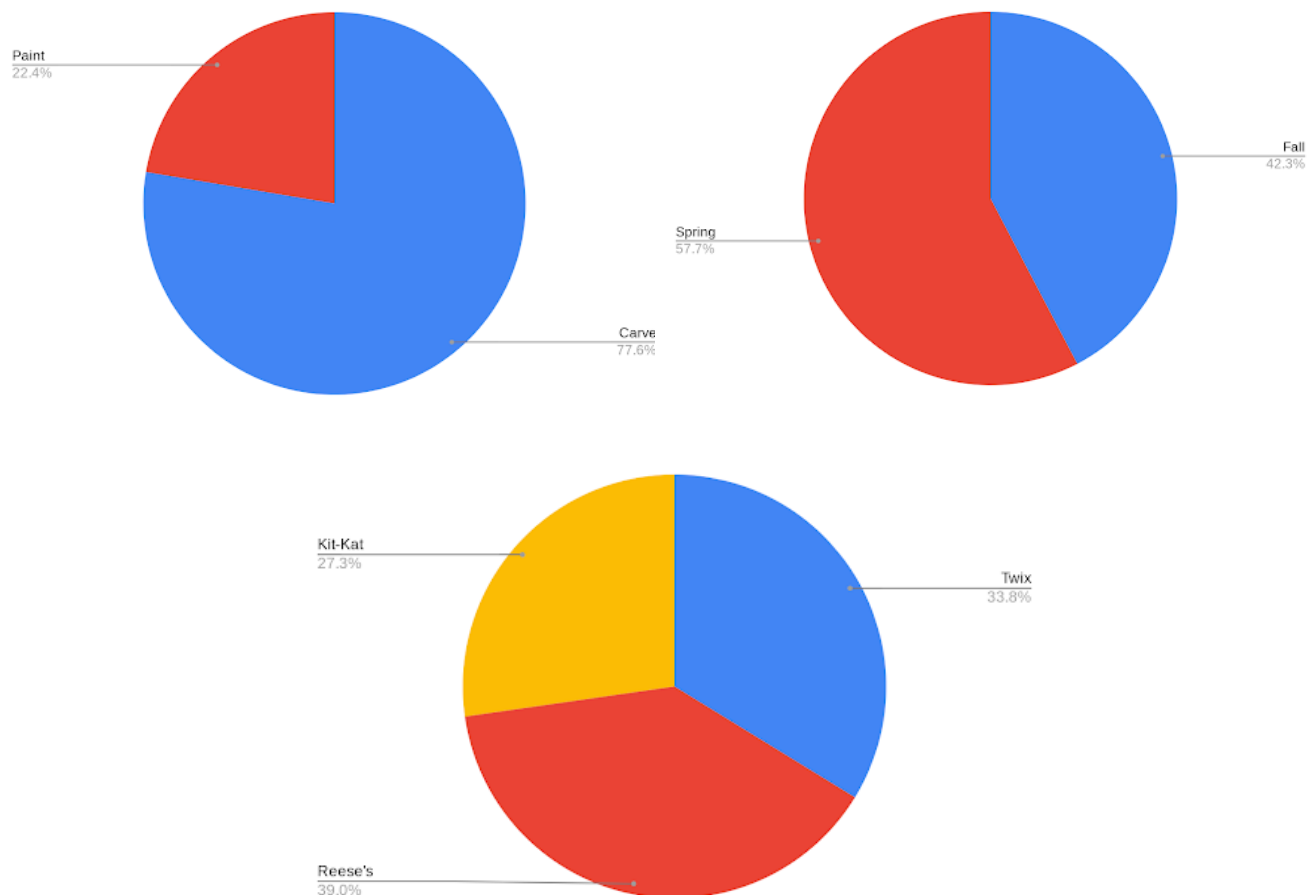


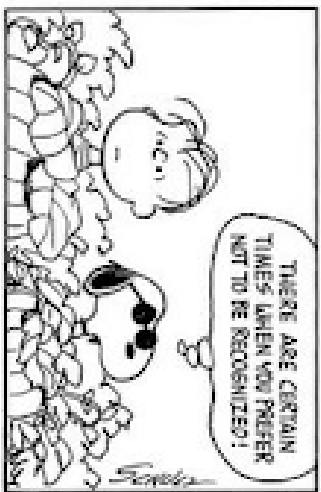
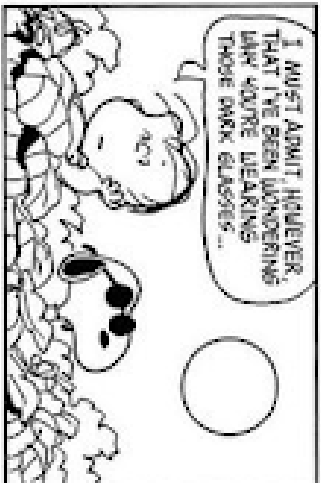
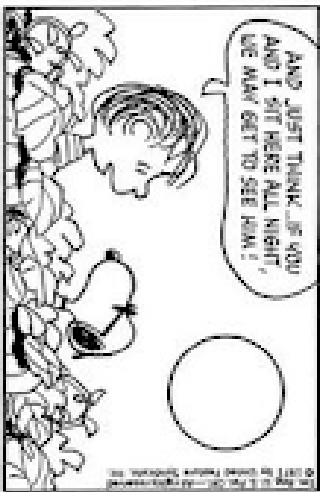
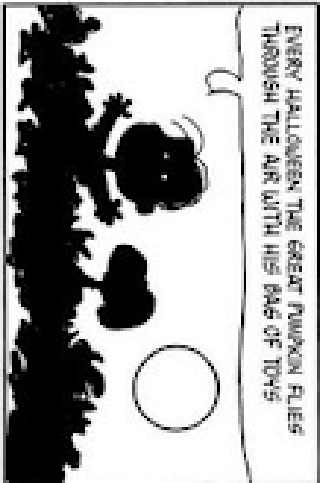
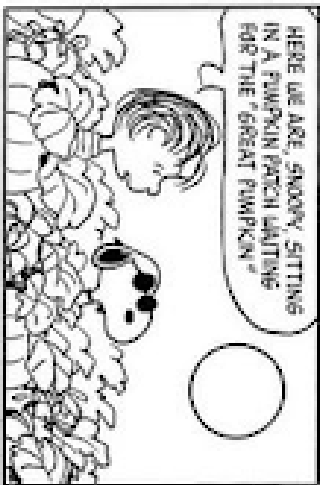
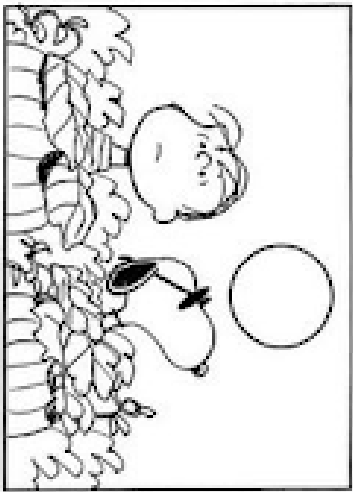
WOULD YOU RATHER
