FFA NEWS

Monday, October 9th, the Froid FFA chapter traveled to Plentywood for the annual district Livestock Judging and Veterinary Medicine competition. In the morning session the Varsity Livestock Judging team consisting of two seniors and two sophomores did very well. The varsity team had three members placing in the top ten and on individual placing first leading the team to a second-place overall team finish qualifying for the state competition in April.

Our Froid JV Livestock Judging individual also did very well, placing in the top 1/3 but the scoring at the top was very close.

In Veterinary Science, the team again did very well with one member finishing first. We had only three team members, but two finishing in the top ten. One individual took first and the third member finished in the top 1/3 of the competitors. We were one individual short of a full team but the team still finished well and qualified for state. We think we have a good candidate for the fourth position and expect to do well in the state competition

Pie Social: The Pie Social was another success this year with \$520 in profit for the library. We couldn't do this without the help from our pie bakers and helpers. This was never more true than this year when I was unable to be there and the Friends of the Library stepped up and took care of everything.

Nemont: In September the library received a generous check for \$600 from Nemont Telephone Cooperative. A donation was made to the Roosevelt County libraries in Froid, Wolf Point, and Culbertson based on the number of phones they sold at the county fair. The total amount was split between the three libraries.
