SCHOOL ELECTION IN MAY

Froid School will hold their school election on Tuesday, May 7,2024. This year there will be two (2) board positions that will be up for election. Anyone interested in running for the School Board may pick up a Declaration of Intent and Oath of Candidacy form from the clerk of the school by March 28, 2024. This form must be filed with the clerk of the school, Joyce Harvey, by March 28, 2024. Also at this election the board anticipates holding mill levy elections for the general fund in both the elementary district and the high school district. The board anticipates holding a mill levy election in the elementary technology fund and the high school technology fund.

FFA NEWS

On Monday, Jan. 22nd, the FFA Mechanics and Agronomy varsity teams traveled to Bainville to compete against other area schools. Kaylee Olson, Addison Elvsaas, Lilly Johnson, and Haven Martensen competed in agronomy, where students were tested on their knowledge of soil types, pests (insects and pathogens), and plant identification. The agronomy team test covered fertilizer application and pest control. The agronomy team did very well, posting a third-place finish. Kaylee and Addison placed 7th and 8th, respectively, and the rest of the team finished in the top 2/3s of the competitors.

The Mechanics team consisted of Sol Grainger, Cody Olson, and Owen Logan. The competition consisted of arc welding, valve train repair, wiring a breaker panel, design a rafter for a dog house, combine parts identification, and a team project of copying a sawhorse, building it, and producing a cut sheet. The Mechanics team did very well; Sol was ranked 13th, Cody 15th, and Owen was in the top 2/3 of the competition. The team finished 7th out of 8 teams despite being short one competitor; if there had been a four-person team, I am confident they would have placed in the top three.

All competitors who went to Bainville placed high enough to attend the state competition this spring. A special shout out to Scott Westlund, Josh Johnson and Sheridan Electric's for help in a wiring workshop that greatly helped the mechanics team, as all three competitors received a 30 out of 30 in the electrical portion of the competition.

Pageturners Book Club: Our next book which we will be discussing on February 28th is State of Wonder by Ann Patchett. Pharmacologist Marina Singh travels to Brazil to bring back information about seemingly miraculous drug research being conducted by her former teacher.
