For the 2022-2023 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

West Shore Elementary has not been given one of these labels.

Key challenges associated with West Shore Elementary include maintaining high levels of achievement as indicated by local assessments and closing the gap in achievement for the bottom 30% of our at risk population.

Initiatives being undertaken at West Shore to accelerate student achievement and close persistent gaps in achievement include the following:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

West Shore Elementary School houses all students in grades Kindergarten - Second grade. Students are expected to meet Michigan Common Core Standards and early childhood developmental guidelines to be enrolled in the next successive grade.

2. STATUS OF SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN.

West Shore Elementary monitors school improvement through the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Our district, and building, monitors and evaluates goals, strategies and activities yearly and utilizes a data driven approach to support high levels of achievement.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WEST SHORE ELEMENTARY

West Shore Elementary is the home to 474 students with membership in general and special education. West Shore Elementary participates in a cooperative agreement with neighboring districts including Linden and Fenton in an effort to provide specialized services that may include but not limited to Priority One, Early

Childhood Special Education (ECSE), Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), and Cognitively Impaired placements. West Shore's teaching staff is highly qualified under the guidelines of the Michigan Department of Education.

Unique features of West Shore Elementary include a high level of parent involvement and shared values between the community and school. West Shore prides itself on developing a comprehensive MTSS and PBIS program to support all students. Our building and district initiative includes a commitment to the PLC process focused on student learning.
