We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Lake Fenton High School. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school was identified as not having any label.

This year we have access to the MSTEP, PSAT 9, PSAT 10 and SAT data from previous years. We continue to use those state measures and our local indicators to track trend data on student performance. Any student achievement gaps are identified, and school improvement measures are taken to develop action plans consisting of strategies and activities.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Lake Fenton High School is composed of students in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12. All students are expected to meet Michigan Common Core Standards. Students are initially assigned to the school by means of a centralized enrollment process. Enrollment is determined by age, grade level, and residence status. Lake Fenton Community Schools also participates in School of Choice and roughly a quarter of our population is enrolled through the School of Choice program.

To be assigned to Lake Fenton schools, a student must meet one of the following criteria: have residence in the district; fill out 105 or 105c paperwork in the time frame identified by the district; or qualify as a homeless/accompanied youth.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Lake Fenton High School monitors school improvement through the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Our district and building monitors and evaluates goals, strategies and activities yearly and utilizes a data driven approach to support high levels of achievement.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Lake Fenton High School is the home to 683 students. The school houses both general education and special education students. Lake Fenton High School participates in a cooperative agreement with neighboring districts including Linden and Fenton in effort to provide specialized services that include Priority One placement, Emotionally Impaired and Cognitively Impaired children.

Lake Fenton High School's teaching staff is highly qualified under the guidelines of the Michigan Department of Education. Unique features of Lake Fenton High School include a high level of community involvement and shared values between the community and school. Our approach to Character Education and Multi-Tiered Systems of Support regarding both social and academic development is systemic and implemented with fidelity. Our Positive Behavior Intervention and Support program has extended this year to include the creation of a student and staff matrix for behavior expectations in a variety of school settings.

4. HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL.

Lake Fenton High School's Core Curriculum, a description of its implementation and an explanation of the variances from the State's model can be accessed through contact with the high school principal.

The state website, www.Michigan.gov houses the core curriculum for the state of Michigan for all public schools to follow. Lake Fenton does not deviate from that curriculum and has curriculum guides developed and located in the principal's office for each class.

6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Lake Fenton High School hosts families of greater than 30% of our students represented by parents during fall Parent Teacher Conferences. These were done in person this year. Additional school to home communication is done through monthly newsletters, quarterly progress reports, twelve-week report cards and daily access to ParentVue and/or StudentVue.

7. FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, ONLY ALSO REPORT ON THE FOLLOWING:

a) THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT)

- Lake Fenton High School had 28 (40 total classes) 1st semester dual enrollments and 28 (43 total classes) 2nd semester dual enrollments.

b) THE NUMBER OF COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES OFFERED (AP/IB)

- Lake Fenton High School offers 7 Advanced Placement courses: AP Language, AP Literature, AP Calculus, AP Studio Art, AP United States History, AP Chemistry and AP Biology.

c) THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES (AP/IB)

- Lake Fenton High School had 73 students enrolled in 102 Advanced Placement courses that could lead to college credit.

d) THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT

- Lake Fenton High School had 73 students who took 102 AP exams, 69 tests received a score of 3 or higher receiving college credit.

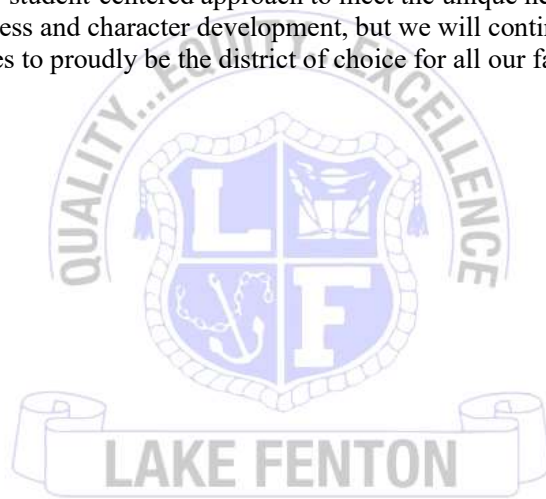
