No symptoms? No worries!

Continue good hand hygiene practices and avoid ill persons.

Symptomatic individuals WITHOUT known exposure to COVID:

Masking and COVID testing are optional.

Free rapid COVID testing is still available by request with a school nurse.

A negative rapid test result after at least 72 hours of symptoms (4th day of illness) is the most reassuring (since negative test results prior to 72 hours of symptoms can be a false-negative due to the likelihood of low viral loads in early COVID illness).

Symptomatic individuals WITH known exposure to COVID:

Follow the free **TEST-MASK-GO** (TMG) process on regularly scheduled school days.

Notify the school nurse (see above) to request a daily rapid COVID test upon arrival to school.

TEST = a daily rapid COVID test is done until a negative test result occurs during the 4th day following symptom onset.

MASK = if the test result is negative, they may attend school if wearing a disposable mask (no cloth masks or gators).

GO = attend classes if the daily test is negative and properly wearing a disposable mask.

The **TEST-MASK-GO** monitoring **stops** once the individual has a negative rapid test during the 4th day of symptoms (*if the 4th day lands on a weekend or absence, the TMG monitoring stops on the morning of the next attended school day*).

If the individual tests negative after at least 72 hours of symptoms (the 4th day of illness), further testing and masking is optional.

A POSITIVE COVID test:

Isolate at home for 5 days (*The date symptoms started or the date of the positive test, whichever came first is considered Day 0*).

Add 6 to the date of Day 0 to know the date isolation is over.

Add 10 to Day 0 to get the final date the positive individual is considered contagious.

On illness days 6 through 10, the individual may return to school if fever-free and properly wearing a disposable mask at all times.

If unable to properly wear a disposable mask, they must stay home through day 10 of infection, or they can forgo masking if they have a negative COVID test during the masking window (days 6 through 10).

Excused Absences & School Attendance:








If the individual has a **positive rapid test** at school, the school nurse coordinates the COVID Care plan, excused absences, and the return to school process. Testing with the school nurse generates a confirmed COVID illnesses, which is medically excused.

If the individual has a **positive home test**, the result MUST BE CONFIRMED to be excused from school. To confirm the test, the guardian or individual must provide proof (such as a picture of the positive test card result that includes the written date and name of the tested individual within the picture), a copy of an official healthcare lab test result, or the positive individual can schedule a free drive-through test with a school nurse for confirmation.

NOTE: Any unconfirmed positive home tests are NOT EXCUSED from school. **They must be confirmed to be excused.**

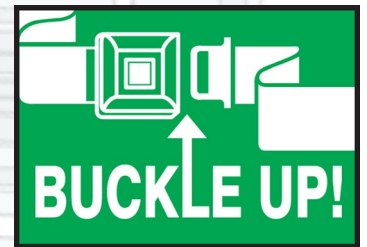

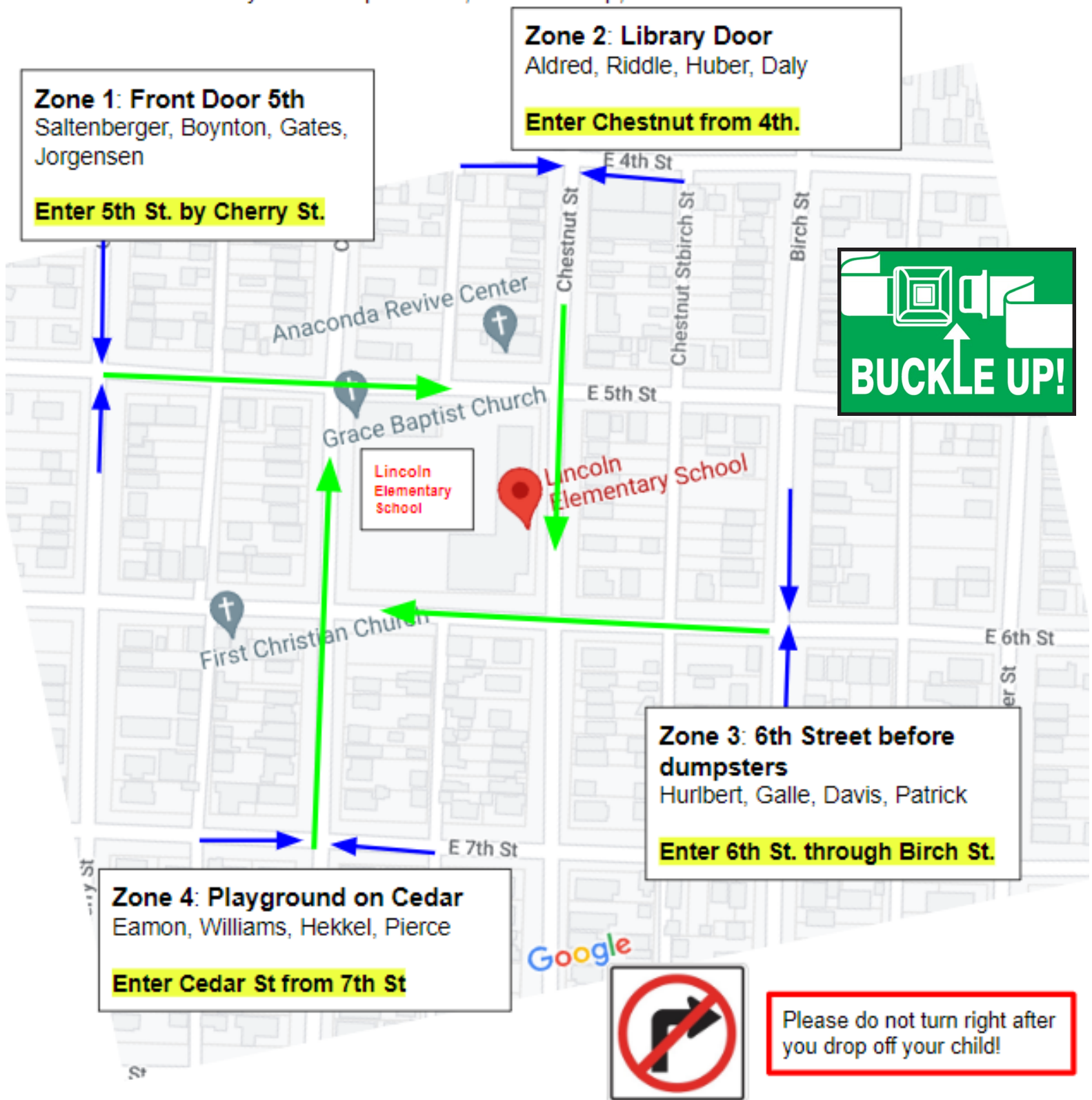

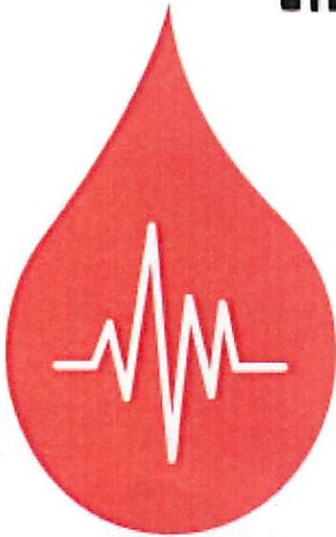
