Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-2023 educational progress for Millington High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality.

We are pleased to report that Millington High School continues to have a very high four-year graduation rate (95.15%). Another point of pride is that more students passed the AP English 12 Exam in 2022-2023 than we have witnessed in the recent past. In addition, 24 students were able to obtain college credits through a dual enrollment (DE) opportunity, in conjunction with Delta College.

Process for Assigning Pupils

Millington Community Schools has two high schools: Millington High School (MHS) and Millington Accelerated Learning Center (MALC). Most of the students attend the MHS and are assigned to the school when they enter ninth grade, move into the district, or become a student through schools of choice. Students who do not wish to learn in a traditional educational setting may opt to attend MALC. Students who are falling behind grade level may also be referred to MALC in the event that they are not on track to graduate with their four-year cohort.

Status of the 5-Year School Improvement Plan

Millington High School has a Building Leadership Team that drives the school improvement process. The Building Leadership Team sets goals for the school, creates an action plan that will help us reach our goals, and works to consistently improve student achievement. The Building Leadership Team uses data to drive the decision-making process and implements research-based interventions and programs to improve student achievement. Our team is in year four of the school improvement planning process. We are continuing to implement strategies that help students who struggle with their attendance, behavior, and course completion. One of the strategies is to improve our data collection process to provide better information to our Student Assistance Team. We are in the fourth year of running a report called Early Warning Signs three times each year to help us identify struggling students. We are also working on improving our credit recovery process and summer school.

Specialized Schools

Millington High School works with the Tuscola Area Technology Center to provide educational opportunities for our students. Students have the opportunity to train for vocational and technical careers at the Tuscola Area Technology Center. They also have the ability to earn on-the-job training through the BIST and Co-Op Programs. Millington High School had 144 students attend the Tech Center in 2022-2023. Our district also offers students the opportunity to attend the Millington Accelerated Learning Center, a credit recovery program for students in grades nine through twelve. It



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
provides students with multiple opportunities for success in a supportive and appropriate environment. The program has been serving students since the 2010-2011 school year. Highland Pines is another program Millington Community School works with to provide educational opportunities to our students. The school provides services to students age zero to twenty-six who may be unable to fully profit from an educational placement in their local school district. Programs are offered for pre-primary impaired, trainable mentally impaired students. A combined effort is directed toward finding the least restrictive educational environment for our students. Millington High School offers students the opportunity to take classes in one of our computer labs through Michigan Virtual High School. Students have access to earn credit in AP courses, foreign language, and other classes that are not offered in the regular classroom setting. Millington High School also offers students a Credit Recovery Program and a Summer School Program to help students who are behind in credits catch up to grade level.

Core Curriculum

The Millington Community School District follows the State of Michigan High School Content Standards and Benchmarks and the Common Core. All lessons are aligned to the HSCEs and Common Core. Staff evaluations include student growth data from PSAT, SAT, and Pre/Post Tests that are course-specific.

Accountability: SAT, M-Step, Advanced Placement, and Local Screenings


The Millington High School staff continually analyzes student data to drive instructional and placement decisions. Multiple sources of data are used to drive the school improvement process. MHS uses two types of local screenings when assessing student achievement. Students take a pre and a post-test to measure how much they grow throughout the school year. The PSAT and SAT are also administered each year and measure student growth in the areas of Reading, Writing, and Math. After each screening, our staff performs an item analysis of each section of the (P)SAT in order to address areas of the curriculum where students are struggling. In the spring of each year, juniors take the M-Step, SAT, and ACT Work Keys tests.

Advanced Placement Testing

Millington High School offers students the opportunity to take Advanced Placement courses through the College Board. If students score a 3 or better on the test, they may earn college credit depending on which institution they attend. MHS offers AP Lang & Comp, AP Lit, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, and AP Calculus, in the regular classroom setting. We also offer a variety of Advanced Placement tests through Michigan Virtual High School.


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Dual Enrollment

Millington High School partners with local colleges and universities to allow students to earn college credit while they are still in high school. We also have students participating in Cardinal College.



Percentage of Students Represented by Parents at Conferences

Millington High School had roughly 25% of parents participating in parent-teacher conferences during the 2022-2023 school year. Parents and teachers communicate throughout the year through e-mails and telephone calls. Parents and students also have the option of looking up grades using our Skyward Program using any device with an Internet connection. Staff members also use the Skyward messaging system to send e-mails and electronic updates on a regular basis.
