Republic County Schools reviewed their student data and other various data points to determine budgetary needs for the 2023-2024 school year.

**Barriers** Identified to overcome for students to achieve grade level proficiency on assessments:

**Time** estimated to achieve grade level proficiency.

Time is relative and it is difficult to set a specific timeframe. The district recently adopted new curriculum in ELA, Math and Science. The teachers need time to implement and students needs time to learn from the new curriculum. Students that are behind grade level expectations take several years to close the gap. As an example- if a student is 1 year behind- it could take a student 4 years at 1.25 years of growth each year to achieve grade level expectations. All students learn at a different rate, but it is the district's expectation that with targeted work we will see gains.
