STATE BOUND



ready for the next level of basketball, state in Great Falls! This is super exciting for the Melstone School and community.









Should Driver's Education be Mandatory?

"In recent years, access to Student Driver Education has been a limiting factor in obtaining a learner's permit for many new drivers. To alleviate this hardship and help young Montanans start learning to drive safely, Attorney General Austin Knudsen has instructed MVD to provide a solution to help student drivers obtain a temporary learner's permit. Under the new guidance, students can start the licensing process at 15 through self-study and behind-the-wheel practice with a parent or responsible adult. These changes are in accordance with § 61-5-105(b), MCA."

Should Montana require everyone to undergo a driver's education course before getting their license? Driver education provides students time to understand the rules of the road, Promotion of Defensive Driving Techniques, Awareness of Risk Factors, and the chance to understand certain situations on the road. Driver ed allows students to learn from a certified instructor, making learning more accessible and safer. Also, driving in the Driver Ed car lets people know you are a new driver, and the instructor has an extra brake to help prevent accidents from new drivers. Here are a few examples of things you will cover in Driver's Ed: Right of Way (When pulling up to a four-way stop), road signs, the safe distance you have to keep from other vehicles, wearing a seat belt, never drinking and driving, only change lanes through hashed or "broken" lines, and always stop before pedestrians. You will also cover situations where an emergency vehicle goes by you (ambulance, firetruck, or police car). You will cover what to do when your tires hydroplane and accelerator gets stuck to the floor. Being prepared to handle situations on the road allows you to drive as safely as possible.

Mandating Driver's Education reflects a proactive approach to promoting road safety and protecting drivers and pedestrians. It equips individuals with the knowledge, skills, and awareness necessary to navigate traffic safely.



PUFF PASTRY GLAZED APRICOT TWISTS



Ingredients: (17 ounce) package frozen puff pastry (thawed according to package directions) 1 cup apricot jam, melted (melt just enough to make spreading easy) 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar 2 tablespoons whipping cream (unwhipped) 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

Steps:

- 1. Set oven to 400 degrees.
- 2. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper (you will most likely need two baking sheets for 16 pastries).
- 3. Roll out one puff pastry sheet onto a lightly floured surface into a 12x10-inch rectangle, then cut in half lengthwise (I use a pizza cutter for this).
- 4. Cut each half crosswise into four 5x3-inch strips (for a total of 8 strips).
- 5. Spread each strip with about 1/2 tablespoon apricot jam, then fold the strips in half lengthwise to form 1-1/2-inch wide strips.
- 6. Twist each strip 3 times, then place on the parchment-lined baking sheet.
- 7. Repeat with the remaining puff pastry (you should have 16 pastries when done, you might have to use two baking sheets.
- 8. Bake for about 15-20 minutes.
- 9. Transfer the twists to a rack
- 10. In a small bowl whisk together confectioners sugar, whipping cream and lemon juice; brush over the warm pastries.




