


### **Policies & Procedures:**

- Tyler ISD operates in compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
  (FERPA). This law allows students and parents to opt-out of the release of certain
  information about students, including photographs. Each school is responsible for
  maintaining a database to determine who cannot be photographed and interviewed
  according to FERPA guidelines via the district's Opt-Out form. Parent permission must
  be confirmed prior to taking photos, videos, and quotes from Tyler ISD students.





### Vocab

- AADD (Academic Achievement Distinction Designation): awards for campuses with outstanding achievements based on outcomes of several performance indicators.
- ACT (American College Test): a standardized test that determines a high school graduates preparedness for college.
- **AP (Advanced Placement):** a program administered by College Board offering students the opportunity to take advanced-level courses and examinations from different academic areas.
- **AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination):** program designed to help underachieving students with high academic potential prepare for entrance to college.
- CTC (Career & Technology Center): a specialized school that prepares students for success in high-demand, high-wage, and high-skill careers.
- CTE (Career & Technical Education): teaching skill-based careers to students; this includes work in the Trade and Industry field.
- **DOE (Department of Education):** establishes policy, administers and coordinates federal assistance, collects data on U.S. schools, and enforces federal education laws regarding privacy and civil rights.
- ESL (English as a Second Language): students who do not speak English as their native language; teachers can pursue certification.
- ESSER III (Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief): recently used for COVID-19 relief funding in March 2021.
- **FERPA (Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act):** a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records; parents have access until a student turns 18 or enters college.
- GPA (Grade Point Average): a number that indicates how well or high students scored in courses on average.
- **GT (Gifted & Talented):** program that children with academic or creative abilities are a part of along with their normal classes.

- HIPAA (Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act): designed to provide privacy standards to protect patients' medical records and other health information provided to health care providers.
- **IEP (Individualized Education Plan):** a written plan that describes individual needs of a student with disabilities and the services, supports, aids, and accommodations/modifications that will be provided.
- LMS (Learning Management System): software that enables companies and educational institutions to create and manage lessons, courses, quizzes, and training materials. (Canvas)
- **NEA (National Education Association):** advocates for education professionals and unites members across the nation to fulfill the promise of preparing every student to succeed in a diverse and interdependent world.
- **NHS (National Honor Society):** a nationwide organization for high school students in the U.S., the selection is based on academic achievement, leadership, service, and character.
- **PEIMS (Public Education Information Management System):** all data requested and received by TEA about public education, including demographics and academic performance for students, personnel, financial, and organizational information.
- **PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test):** three related assessments, with one being the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship.
- **PTA (Parent-Teacher Association):** an organization of parents, teachers, and staff that is intended to facilitate parental involvement in a school.
- SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test): a college entrance examination.
- SBE (State Board of Education): sets policies and standards for Texas public schools.
- **SEL (Social & Emotional Learning):** the process through which students acquire the knowledge, attitudes, and skills they need to: recognize and manage emotions, demonstrate caring/concern for others, establish positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

- **SPED (Special Education):** the practice of educating students in a way that provides accommodations that address individual differences, disabilities, and special needs.
- STAAR (State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness): annual exam to measure student learning.
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math): integrates all four disciplines together into a single, cross-disciplinary program that offers instruction in real-world applications and teaching methods.
- TASA (Texas Association of School Administrators): professional association for Texas school superintendents and other administrators.
- TASB (Texas Association of School Boards): a nonprofit, voluntary, statewide educational association that serves and represents local Texas school boards.
- **TEA (Texas Education Agency):** the state agency which oversees primary and secondary public education in Texas.
- **TEKS (Texas Essential Knowledge & Skills):** Texas state standards for public school from kindergarten to grade 12.
- TSPRA (Texas School Public Relations Association): a professional organization whose members are dedicated to improving public education in Texas.
- UIL (University Interscholastic League): provides educational extracurricular academic, athletic, and music contests

### **HIPAA vs FERPA:**

- **HIPAA** is for medical-related purposes only. This is to keep medical-related information private from everyone unless the patient is willing to share. Also, this means that employers/schools cannot ask for any information from physicians but may request doctor's notes in leaves of absence.
- **FERPA** is for student education purposes only. This law keeps student educational records private from everyone except parents when the child is under 18/not in college. This means that educators cannot give out information to the public about specified students.

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

### COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an allhazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure (Lockout), Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

"In Your Room or Area. Clear the Halls."

Students are trained to:

- Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual

### Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

### SECURE

"Get Inside. Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door



- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

### EVACUATE

"To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

### Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to take anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.

### SHELTER

"State Hazard and Safety Strategy"

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hazmat
- Earthquake
- Tsunami

### Safety Strategies might include:

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground

### Students are trained in:

Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies

### Adults and staff are trained in:

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies
- Accounting for students and adults
- Reporting injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.
