


Prior to construction of the Middle School in 2006, the Boone Board of Education developed a long-range facilities plan for upgrading our school buildings. This included:

- Restructuring of elementary buildings and elimination of use of 1938 buildings Garfield, Lowell, and Bryant.
- Remodeling and additions to Franklin Elementary as a 2-4 grade building.
- Use of Lincoln School (1938) and Page School (1961) as PK-1 buildings.
- Construction of a new Middle School (6-8 grades in 2006), 5th grade addition in (2009)
- Completion of a new High School project (2015).
- Planning for a new (possibly PK-1) elementary project to replace Lincoln and Page Elementary buildings.

This, along with sound fiscal planning, has allowed the district to significantly improve our school facilities. The next step, currently in motion, is planning for a new elementary school which will benefit families in location on the south side of town with Franklin remaining on the north side of town. Additionally, the school location can enhance the economic development and growth of the city. Watch for more information as this project develops.

SUPPORTING ACADEMIC RIGOR AND EXPANDING LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES


Through post-secondary enrollment options students have the opportunity to take college courses offered at Iowa State University, Des Moines Area Community College, and Boone High School.



CLIMATE SURVEY

During second semester of the 2018-19 school year, the BCSD conducted a climate survey asking parents, teachers, employees, and students their perceptions of the BCSD. The survey respondents offered the following positive perspectives:

- 88% offered students feel their education is meaningful.

- » Winter Wonderland for Toreador Tots with winter themed activities for families of kids 0-5.

Spring Events:

- » Kindergarten Experience Days, incoming kindergarteners are brought in for a day to see what a day in the life of a kindergartener will look like as they get ready to take on that next step.

The final phase of this long-term facilities plan is the construction of a new early childhood elementary school to replace Lincoln and Page The district has land set aside for future purchase. This is the initial plan for the elementary project.
