Annual Declaration of Intent to Provide Home-Based Instruction

A parent who intends to cause his/her child or children to receive home-based instruction in lieu of attendance or enrollment in a public school, approved private school, or an extension program of an approved private school, *must file an annual Declaration of Intent to Provide Home-Based Instruction with the District Superintendent by* <u>September</u> <u>15 or within two weeks of the beginning of any public school quarter, trimester or semester (RCW 28A.200)</u> in the format prescribed below:

I do hereby declare that I am the parent, guardian, or legal custodian of the child(ren) listed below; that said child(ren) is (are) between the ages of 8 and 18 and as such are subject to the requirements found in Chapter 28A.225 RCW, Compulsory Attendance; I intend to cause said child(ren) to receive home-based instruction as specified in RCW 28A.225.010(4); and if a certificated person will be supervising the instruction, I have indicated this by checking the appropriate space.

Requirements to provide home-based instruction as listed in RCW 28A.225.010(4):

- ✓ The parent has completed a course in home-based instruction at a post-secondary institution; or
- ✓ The parent has been deemed qualified by the superintendent of the district in which the student lives.

Summary of Legal Requirements Related to Home-Based Instruction

RCW 28A.225.010

Instructional Program Content

Home-based schooling shall consist of "...planned and supervised instructional and related educational activities, including the basic skills of occupational education, science, mathematics, language, social studies, history, health, reading, writing, spelling and the development of an appreciation of art and music."

RCW 28A.200.010 Student Placement Upon Returning to Public School

At the time of a transfer to a public school from home-based instruction, the local school district may require that a standardize achievement test be administered to the child, and the district will determine appropriate grade and course placement of the student after consultation with the parent and review of the student's records.

RCW 28A.200

Parent Duties

- File annually a signed declaration of intent to provide home-based instruction;
- Ensure that test scores or annual academic progress assessments and immunization records, together with any other records that are kept relating to the instructional and educational activities provided, are forwarded to any other public or private school to which the child transfers;
- Ensure that a standardized achievement test approved by the state board of education is administered annual to the child by a qualified individual or that an annual assessment of the student's academic progress is written by a certificated person who is currently working in the field of education. The standardized test results or the annual academic progress assessment report shall be made part of the child's permanent records. If, as a result of the annual test or assessment, it is determined that the child is not making reasonable progress consistent with his or her age or stage of development, the parent shall make a good faith effort to remedy the deficiency.

*Failure of a parent to comply with the duties in this section shall be deemed a failure of such parent's child to attend school without valid justification under RCW 28A.225.020 and are liable for prosecution. Public school officials are required to report cases of noncompliance to the person designated as the enforcement officer of the truancy laws as stated in RCW 28A.225.

RCW 28A.225.010

Instructional and Educational Activities Must Be:

- Provided by a parent who is instructing his or her child only and is supervised by a person certificated under **RCW 28A.410**. The supervision consists of and includes planning of objectives by the certificated person and the parent, a minimum each month of an average of one contact hour per week with the child being supervised by the certificated person, and evaluation of such child's progress by the certificated person. The number of children supervised by the certificated person shall not exceed 30; or
- Provided by a parent who is instructing his or her child only and who has either earned 45 college-level credit hours or equivalent in semester hours or has completed a course in home-based instruction at a post-secondary institution or a vocational-technical institute;
- Provided by a parent who is deemed sufficiently qualified to provide home-based instruction by the superintendent of the local school district in which the child resides.
