## Nomination Window: January 3-26, 2024 Nominations must be submitted by January 26, 2024

LEAP (Logic, Enrichment, and Academic Pursuit) is an intervention program for students who have been identified as gifted learners. Raymore-Peculiar School District LEAP program services gifted students in grades 2-12. Students in 1st-7th grades can be nominated to be evaluated for the district gifted program. A parent or teacher may complete the form found at the following link:

Gifted Education in Raymore-Peculiar schools encourages students to assume greater responsibility for recognizing and fulfilling their own affective and cognitive potential in an environment stimulated by the interaction of intellectual peers.

## **LEAP students:**

- Are given instruction with an accelerated pace, compacting the material to meet their identified cognitive development, as well as their affective needs.
- Have demonstrated exceptionality or precocious development of mental capacity
- Have a learning potential and the need to work at levels beyond those expected at the student's age/grade.
- Are provided opportunities that allow for the expression of some aspect of the individual's interests, needs, abilities, and learning preferences.
- Have the opportunity to experience intellectual or artistic demands commensurate with their needs and abilities and to utilize guidance and resources corresponding with their interests.

Candidates must reach qualifying levels on identified assessments in order to participate in the LEAP program. These qualifying levels are prescribed by the Missouri Department of Elementary & Secondary Education and have been adapted to the Raymore-Peculiar LEAP program.

## A student is required to qualify in three of the four following areas:

- Academic Achievement: A student must score at or above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile on a standardized achievement test.
- Intellectual Ability: A student must score at or above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile on an acceptable IQ test.
- Reasoning, and Problem-solving Ability: A student must score at or above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile on an acceptable Reasoning and Problem-solving test.
- Other Documentation: A student must receive a superior score on an acceptable measure that documents characteristics of gifted children and provides evidence of exceptional performance; or have participated in a previous gifted program.

If the student is already in the LEAP/Gifted program they **DO NOT** need to be nominated again.
