Important Changes Regarding FAFSA

6 Things to Know About the New FAFSA

With the 2024-25 application...

- The FAFSA® will open in December 2023 rather than October 2023.
- The FAFSA form will be shorter and easier for students and families to complete when they consent to
 provide their federal tax information via a direct data share with the IRS.
- Applicants and contributors will need an FSA ID to apply for federal student aid, so encourage students to create an FSA ID as early as possible at StudentAid.gov.
- The new Student Aid Index (SAI) will replace the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) in the calculation to
 determine eligibility for need-based funding. So, the new formula will be cost of attendance (COA) SAI =
 financial need.
- Students who are unhoused, orphans, former foster youth, or who have other circumstances that prevent them from providing parental information will benefit from simplified questions that more efficiently determine their independent status.
