

What Is Title I?

Adairsville Elementary School has been identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement plan.

Adairsville Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.



23/24 School Improvement Goals

- Increase the number of students scoring proficient or distinguished by 3 percentage points on the Georgia Milestones ELA and Science EOG assessments by the end of the 2023/2024 school year.
- Increase the number of students scoring proficient or distinguished by 3 percentage points on the Georgia Milestones Math EOG assessment by the end of the 2023/2024 school year.
- For the 2022-2023, 54.7% of office referrals were for physical aggression. For the 2023-2024 school year, our goal is to have a 5% decrease in these behaviors using our BASE Learning curriculum to support social and emotional situations by demonstrating improved desired behaviors, promoting communication with peers and adults, and learning responsible behaviors to use in personal, school and community contexts.
