POSITION SUMMARY:

The role of the Mentor is to be an advisor in the role of recruiting/engagement, retention and re-engagement strategies for online students. This position will work closely with other assigned mentors to recruit, enroll, retain and engage online students. In particular for students that have fallen behind on their weekly engagement sessions or fallen behind on their academic progress and performance. Students that have a relationship with their mentor, built on trust, will have a greater chance of success than any other student would have. This position will be held to a high level of accountability and responsibility for ensuring student success. This means, student engagement, academic success, course completion, retention, wraparound services, dropout prevention and graduation.
