GENERAL PUBLIC



COVID-19 EXPOSURE

- Test 3-5 days after exposure.
- Mask for 10 days even if you have no symptoms.
- Monitor yourself for symptoms.

CDPH What to Do If You Are Exposed to COVID-19



POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST

- Seek treatment if you have symptoms.
- Isolate by staying home 5-10 days after positive test.
- Isolation can end after Day 5 if improvement in symptoms and no fever for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications.

MASKING

- Mask if you have coughing/sneezing/ sore throat/runny nose.
- Mask if you have been exposed or are infected with COVID-19.
- Masks should be wellfitting and provide good filtration.

BUSINESSES/ EMPLOYERS

- Non-medical workplace employers will adhere to CalOSHA Emergency Temporary Standards.
- Employers will initiate
 Outbreak Response
 measures if three or
 more employees test
 positive within 14 days.

SCHOOLS AND DAYCARES



COVID-19 EXPOSURE

- Schools may provide general exposure notification to school community when there is a high level of risk of any infectious disease.
- Students with known exposure to COVID-19 should follow exposure guidelines for general public.

POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST

- Symptomatic students should wear a mask and be tested for COVID-19 immediately.
- Symptomatic students should not return to campus until feeling better and 24 hours have gone by without fever and without the use of feverreducing medication.
- Students and staff who test positive should follow the general public guidance.

MASKING

- No person can be prevented from wearing a mask unless wearing a mask poses a safety hazard.
- Masks are a highly effective and inexpensive tool for mitigating transmission of respiratory diseases.

- Schools may report outbreaks to the Public Health Department.

ACUTE CARE FACILITIES



COVID-19 EXPOSURE

 Health care facilities are required to follow All Facilities Letters (AFLs), Cal/OSHA regulations, and CDC and CDPH COVID-19 guidelines for healthcare personnel.

MASKING

 Health care facilities are required to follow the Cal/OSHA Aerosol Transmissible Disease standard that requires the use of N95 respirators for worker protection during the care of suspect or confirmed COVID-19 cases.

OUTBREAK RESPONSE

- As workplaces, acute care facilities will adhere to Cal/OSHA COVID-19 prevention and notification regulations.
- Acute care facilities will report outbreaks (a disease incident of three or more cases in a week) to the Public Health Department.

REPORTING

 Healthcare providers shall report hospitalization and/or death of a patient due to COVID-19 within one working day and will report weekly all positive COVID-19 patients to the CDC National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN).

 Health Care Facilities are required to follow All Facilities Letters (AFLs), Cal/OSHA regulations, and CDC and CDPH COVID-19 guidelines for healthcare personnel.

RESIDENT COVID-19 EXPOSURE/ POSITIVE TEST

 SNFs should ensure residents identified with confirmed COVID-19 are isolated in a designated COVID-19 isolation area and will comply with mitigation strategies outlined in AFL 12-12 and CDC Infection Control recommendations.

MASKING

SNFs are required to follow the Cal/OSHA Aerosol Transmissible Disease standard that requires the use of N95 respirators for worker protection during the care of suspect or confirmed COVID-19 cases.
