As most of you likely know, we have had an interesting start to the school year at Sullivan High School. Due to the construction process of a new high school, the environment has been altered with the addition of the 7th and 8th grades to the current high school building. Despite the inherent challenges that come with such a change, our students and staff have allowed for the transition to go smoothly, making
 the best out of a tough situation.
Our extracurricular activities had an exciting fall. Football had arguably their best season in over 20 years, finishing with a 9 and 2 record and making it to the second round of the playoffs for the first time since 2001.
