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#### From the Desk of Mr. Ogle

As I write this message, we are just a little over 30 school days away from the end of the 2023-2024 school year, and I can honestly say that it has been one of the best school years of my career here in Sullivan. In spite of having to utilize some creative uses of space as construction continues on the new Sullivan High School, we have had a tremendous year in so many ways.



To begin with, the Sullivan Redskins have been doing a tremendous amount of winning in pretty much every sport at

every level. In the fall, our SMS Softball team won the first regional championship in program history (as far as we were able to determine), and the SMS Baseball team came up just shy of their own regional championship to cap off a season where they picked up a JHOC Conference Championship. Our SMS Boys and Girls Cross-Country teams both picked up JHOC Conference Championships and qualified for the state meet for the first time in program history as well.

Winter saw our basketball programs pick up where our fall sports left off, winning at a high level. Our 6th grade boys and girls put together nearly undefeated seasons, and our 7th and 8th grade teams were equally impressive with the 7th grade boys winning the JHOC Conference tournament and a regional championship, eventually falling just short of a trip to the state tournament. The 8th grade boys, not to be outdone, picked up a 2nd place finish in the JHOC Conference tournament and made a run at their own regional championship, coming up just short in the semi-final round. The girls basketball team was equally impressive. While neither team picked up the hardware that the boys did, they did perform well enough to enter regional play with high seeds, including a #1 seed for the 7th grade girls, though neither tournament turned out how we expected based on the way the girls had performed throughout the season. Our volleyball teams continued the trend of competing at a high level, accumulating winning records at all three levels.

Also competing this winter were our Singers Jr show choir and scholastic bowl teams. You may have guessed it, but they also did a lot of winning, with Singers Jr bringing home multiple Grand Champions and scholastic bowl challenging for yet another JHOC Conference Championship.

The only spring sport at the middle school level is track, and just for the sake of consistency, they are off to a great start to the season, picking up overall 1st place finishes for both the boys and girls in their first meet of the season.

The reason I wanted to use this space to highlight the success of our extra-curricular activities is because I believe that those wins are downstream of other wins that aren't as apparent to the outside observer. Over the last year, I have witnessed a shift in the overall culture in our building. While we still are not perfect, and frankly never will be, our students are buying into concepts like respect, accountability, and self-discipline in ways that are positively impacting their learning environment and our academic performance. I believe this growth in our student body, along with dedicated coaches and teachers guiding them along the way, is why we are seeing our students experience success unlike anything we have seen at Sullivan Middle School in my time here. I want to thank the community of Sullivan for supporting our young people throughout this school year and really letting them know how proud we all are of them.

#### **SHS Baseball**


