# Budget Public Meeting Monday, May 12, 2025 at 7:00 PM

HS Auditorium followed immediately by a regular Board of Education meeting.

Absentee Ballots are sent to registered voters of Genesee, Livingston and Wyoming counties who reside in the Pavilion Central School District and who are shown on the listing received by each County's Election Bureau as being permanently disabled. Any eligible voter who would like to request an absentee ballot, can do so by completing an application for absentee ballot. An application can be obtained by contacting Mary Jo Pahl in the District Office via email to mjpahl@pavilioncsd. org, or by phone to 585-584-1013. Absentee ballot applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be picked up personally by the voter. Military voters who are not currently registered with the District may apply to register as a qualified voter of the District, said application must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 PM on the 26th day before the election. A military voter may designate a preference to receive a military voter registration, ballot application or ballot by mail, fax, or email. Ballots for military voters shall be mailed, or otherwise distributed, no later than 25 days prior to the election. A military voter who is listed as an overseas voter that is received from the county will automatically be sent an absentee ballot in the preferred method that is stated on the county listing. Pursuant to Section 2018-f of the Education Law, applications for early mail ballots may be obtained at the Office of the District Clerk of the School District, during all days in which the School District is in session. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk no earlier than April 21, 2025 and by May 13, 2025, if the early mail ballot is to be mailed to the voter. If the early mail ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter at the Office of the District Clerk the completed application must be received by the District Clerk no later than May 19, 2025.

# Superintendent's Message

## Pavilion Central School Community,

The District will hold the annual Public Meeting this year on May 12, 2025 at 7:00 PM in the High School Auditorium. Information will be presented on the following proposals, which will appear on the ballot at the Annual Budget Vote on May 20, 2025 in the High School Auditorium foyer from Noon through 8:00 PM.

### Proposition 1: Annual Budget Referendum 2025 - 2026

The Board of Education has approved, for your consideration, a budget for the 2025-2026 school year in the amount of \$19,426,745. Overall, this reflects a year-to-year spending increase of \$248,667 or 1.3%. The tax levy will increase by \$208,112 or 3.5% to \$6,15,4150.

### **Proposition 2: School Board Member Election**

We are asking voters to vote for two (2) Board of Education members. We have two (2) seats open on the Board this year; each seat is for a five (5) year term. This year Callin Ayers-Tillotson (incumbent) and Margaret (Peg) Gaston (incumbent) are running unopposed.

### Proposition 3: Hollwedel Memorial Public Library Tax Levy

The Hollwedel Memorial Public Library is asking the public to vote on an increase in the annual tax levy from \$132,600.00 to \$138,600.00, beginning with the 2025-2026 school year and thereafter, until changed by further vote of the majority of electors of the Pavilion Central School District.

### **Proposition 4: Hollwedel Memorial Public Library Trustees**

The Hollwedel Memorial Public Library is asking the public to vote for two (2) trustees, each seat is for a three (3) year term. The candidates Stephen Gould (incumbent) and Timothy Wasiewicz (incumbent) are running unopposed.

**Additional Items of Note:** Included in this budget are funds for another \$100,000 capital outlay exception project. This project will include door replacement/ upgrades/access controls and masonry restoration at the Middle/High School building. Capital outlay projects qualify for building aid the following year which is at the rate of approximately 85% for our district.

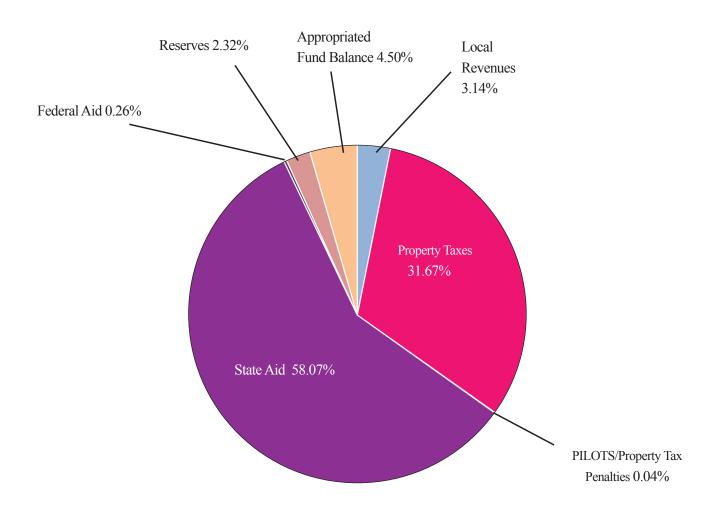

### **Estimated Tax Information, Pavilion Central School District**

Homeowners are eligible for tax relief under New York State's School Tax Relief Program (STAR). Upon application, homeowners may be eligible for up to a \$30,000 decrease in their assessment. Senior citizens (age 65 and older) may be eligible for Enhanced STAR for up to an \$84,000 decrease in their assessment.
