ACADEMIC QUIZ TEAM – Do you like Jeopardy? Trivia Crack? Would you like to travel to campuses across the Midwest to show off your trivia skills? Then Academic Quiz Team is for you! We welcome any student, freshman through senior, and practice twice weekly. We attend over 20 tournaments a year and have qualified for national tournaments every year over the past 15 years. Five to seven participants work together as a team to create their unique solution to a Team Challenge, which can have a focus that is theatrical, structural, improvisational, scientific, of the fine arts, technical, service learning based, – or a blend of several disciplines. Teams also learn and practice creative quick-thinking skills for the Instant Challenge portion of the program. Students compete in a regional competition and may even compete at the state or national level against 22 other countries. Advisor: Mrs. Staub
