JOB TITLE: General Maintenance

SUMMARY: Assists maintenance and custodial staff in maintaining facilities and grounds.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following, but are not limited to:

Mows lawns, trims and edges around walks, flower beds and buildings.

Prunes shrubs and trees to shape and improve growth or remove damaged leaves, branches, or twigs.

Sprays lawn, shrubs, and trees with fertilizer, herbicides, and insecticides.

Cleans grounds, sidewalks and removes litter.

Shovels snow from walks and driveways and spreads salt on public passageways to prevent ice buildup.

Plants grass, flowers, trees, and shrubs. Waters lawn and shrubs.

Repairs fences, gates, walls, and walks.

Cleans out drainage ditches and culverts.

Sharpens tools such as weed cutters, edging tools, and shears.

Makes minor repairs on equipment such as lawn equipment.

Cleans work area, tools, and equipment.

Cleans and maintains interiors of Board facilities, including light bulb replacement, ceiling tile replacement and general custodial duties.

Paints interior and exterior of facilities.

NON-ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSBILITIES:

Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE:

High school diploma or general education degree (GED). Related experience and/or training preferred.

LANGUAGE SKILLS:

Ability to read and comprehend simple instructions, short correspondence, and memos. Ability to write simple correspondence. Ability to effectively present information in one-on-one and small group situations.

MATHEMATICAL SKILLS:

Ability to add, subtract, multiply, and divide in all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions and decimals. Ability to compute, rate, ratio and percent.

REASONING ABILITY:

Ability to apply common sense understanding to carry out detailed but uninvolved written or oral instructions. Ability to deal with problems involving a few concrete variables in standardized situations.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to stand; walk; use hands to finger, handle, or feel objects, tools, or controls; and reach with hands and arms. The employee frequently is required to talk or hear. The employee is occasionally required to sit; climb or balance; and stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl.

The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 100 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

While performing the duties of this job, the employee occasionally works near moving mechanical parts; in high, precarious places; and in outside weather conditions and is occasionally exposed to fumes or airborne particles, risk of electrical shock, and vibration.
