SUMMARY: Provides assistance to students experiencing behavioral/emotional/academic difficulties and to their families by performing the following duties.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following:

Work with students exhibiting behavioral problems in school.

Work with students exhibiting emotional difficulties and learning problems.

Assist classroom teachers, principals, counselors and parents in working with students exhibiting emotional difficulties, behavior difficulties and learning problems.

Assist intervention efforts prior to referral for possible special education placement.

Assist in identifying children for special education placement.

Provide psycho educational assessments as needed.

Assist in the referral of students with special needs to community resources.

Assist families of students experiencing behavioral/emotional difficulties.

Assist with intervention during emergency situations.

Re-evaluate special education students.

Assist and cooperate with the juvenile court authorities on case dispositions.

Participate in faculty in-services.

Serve as a resource for counselors.

Interact and cooperate with community agencies.

Maintain records as required by law, school board policy and administrative regulations.

Ensure compliance with special education laws, Section 504, the Americans with Disabilities Act and all related policies and procedures.

NON-ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE:

Master's degree (M.A.) from an accredited institution. Minimum of two years successful teaching experience. Certification as school Psychologist, AA Certification and above or appropriate related certification and/or licensure.

LANGUAGE SKILLS:

Ability to read, analyze, and interpret common scientific and technical journals, financial reports, and legal documents. Ability to respond to common inquiries complaints from students, parents, regulatory agencies, or members of the business community. Ability to write speeches and articles for publication that conform to prescribed style and format. Ability to effectively present information and respond to questions from groups of students, parents, and the general public.

MATHEMATICAL SKILLS:

Ability to add, subtract, multiply, and divide in all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions, and decimals. Ability to compute rate, ratio, and percent and to draw and interpret bar graphs. Ability to apply basic statistical concepts.

REASONING ABILITY:

Ability to define problems, collect data, establish facts, and draw valid conclusions. Ability to interpret an extensive variety of technical instructions in mathematical or diagram form and deal with several abstract and concrete variables.

CERTIFICATES, LICENSES, REGISTRATIONS:

Alabama Class A certificate with an endorsement in school psychology and/or in school psychometry and emotional conflict. Valid Alabama driver's license.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to talk or hear. The employee frequently is required to stand; walk; and use hands to finger, handle, or feel objects, tools, or controls. The employee is occasionally required to sit; reach with hands and arms; and stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl.
