## **School and Community**

New Rochelle is a suburban city of 79,946, located along the shores of the Long Island Sound in southern Westchester County just outside of New York City. New Rochelle High School, with its smaller learning communities, is dedicated to developing responsible, respectful, tolerant citizens who value cultural diversity and who possess the intellectual, social and emotional independence to become lifelong learners and contributing members of a global society. New Rochelle High School is culturally rich comprised of 53% Hispanic or Latino, 21% African American or Black, 20% White, 5% Asian, 1% Multi-Racial and Native American.

# **Programs and Highlights**

- State of the art facilities that include a planetarium and the Museum of Arts and Culture which is the only Regents chartered museum in a school in New York State
- 32 Advanced Placement courses 101 National Scholars in 2023
- The P.A.V.E. Program (Performing and Visual Arts Education) offers six areas of artistic
  discipline preparing talented students for postsecondary education in the Arts. Upon
  completion of designated theory and performance course work, students will earn a
  special Performing Arts endorsement on their high school diploma.
- At the end of each sports season, the NYSPHSAA honors those teams and individuals who excel in the classroom. Those student-athletes, teams, and schools work very hard throughout the year and deserve to be recognized for their academic success. To receive Scholar-Athlete team recognition with a certificate, the team's average GPA for 75% of the roster must be greater than or equal to 90.00. This means you take 75% of your roster and then average their GPAs. Over the years, New Rochelle Athletics teams have achieved this award representing the district's eye towards an education-based athletics philosophy.
- The CILA Program (Children's International Language Academy) offers students in Grades K-8 dual language instruction in either Spanish/English or Italian/English.
- Ignite is a student-to-student mentoring program designed to foster a positive school
  environment and help freshman make a successful transition to high school. Juniors and
  seniors receive extensive mentorship and leadership training and then are assigned to
  small groups of ninth graders for monthly peer meetings
- Latinx Youth Conference is an empowerment program for Latina and Latino students from Westchester and neighboring counties that is run entirely by students
- 250 students each year take advantage of Career and Technical Education programs provided through Southern Westchester BOCES
