Larkin has been with Kent City Schools since 1996. He began his career with the district as a social studies teacher and basketball coach, and, most recently, served as the district's assistant superintendent and director of personnel.

The Ohio School Boards Association facilitated the search, and the Kent Board of Education selected Larkin from a quality group


