CONFERENCE APPOINTMENT SCHEDULING: Theodore Roosevelt High School will continue to use <u>Meet the Teacher</u>, which is an online parent teacher scheduler. 

The Kent TRHS CTE staff will be working on developing curriculum maps & unit plans, analyzing common assessment data, and developing high-quality student data sources. Student fee invoices were recently mailed. Fee invoices may be paid electronically using www.mypaymentsplus.com or in person (cash, check, or card) with our building cashier, Mrs. D'Sidocky in the Activities Office, room 106.

The deadline for AP Test Registration for the May tests is November 9, 2023. The cost of each exam is \$103, which needs to be paid through *MyPaymentsPlus*. Students on the free/reduced lunch program may take the test at no charge, as determined by the College Board and the State of Ohio (these students still need to go into MPP and go through the ordering screen). If an exam is ordered but not taken or ordered past the November 9 deadline, there is a \$40 penalty fee that your family will be charged, per the College Board making the price \$143 per test. Please email Mrs. D'Sidocky (kdsidocky@kentschools.net) & Ms. Sepi (jsepi@kentschools.net) if you order a late test past the November 9, deadline. Students should make sure that you are enrolled in your AP classroom, that is how Ms. Sepi knows to order you a test.


