ATTENDANCE REMINDERS: Now that we are nearing the middle of the school year, please be reminded of the attendance policy in the <u>TRHS Student & Parent Handbook 2023-24 (BOE Approved)</u>. As stated in the handbook, specifically pertaining to medical absences, "absences will be considered Medically Excused when a doctor's note is provided for illnesses and doctor's appointments. This will only apply to the dates as specified in the note." This means that doctor's notes are needed whenever a student has to miss school for an appointment (primary physician, dentist, orthodontist, counseling, hospital, etc.). Additionally, if a student misses school because of illness, a doctor's note is also preferred. 
