ACT/Plan Testing On February 27, 2024, all Freshman and Juniors are to report to school. Freshmen are taking the PreACT 9 and Juniors are taking the state mandated ACT.

- FRESHMAN & JUNIORS should be at school by 7:15 am; the tests start at 7:30 am. Students will report to the room where they are taking the test. The room assignments will be sent to each student via their school email. In addition, the list of rooms and rosters will be posted outside of the counseling office and the library.
- SOPHOMORES & SENIORS will not report to school that day. Sophomores will have asynchronous classroom assignments. The Seniors will be independently exploring post-secondary opportunities of enrollment, enlistment, and employment.

<u>Scheduling for 2024-25</u> is underway. Discuss with your students their classes for the next school year. Parents have access to the <u>Schoolinks</u> platform. This platform is how you can see what courses your student has requested for next school year, college and career matching features, and a scholarship search. 
