







## CMS DRESS CODE

In accordance with the school district's Dress Code Policy (policy available on our district website), Claremont Middle School agrees that in order to maintain a safe, positive, uninterrupted educational atmosphere the following will not be allowed in the Claremont Middle School:

- Hoods must be removed upon entering the school.
- Chains, spikes, and other unsafe attire are not allowed.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must fully cover upper thighs.
- Shirts and tops must be at a minimum waist length with no torso skin showing.
- Pants or shorts must be worn at or above the hips. Pants must not drag on the floor.
- **Pajamas are not allowed.**
- Jackets and coats are not to be worn in the classroom or hallways during school hours. Jackets may be worn if there is a problem with the heat (and with teacher permission.)
- Undergarments should not be visible at any time.
- Safe footwear should be worn at ALL times. Slippers are not allowed. Please keep in mind that in the event of a school emergency evacuation, students need footwear that would allow them to walk from CMS to our evacuation site. The expectation is that students will have sneakers for PE classes.
- Students will be asked to remove any piercings for safety reasons, i.e., physical education classes, for sports participation and at other times when deemed necessary.
- Clothing must be free of provocative features, obscene writing, graphics or references to drugs, alcohol, or tobacco.
- Students will be asked to wash or remove writing from their skin.
- No sunglasses indoors.
- All bags, purses, totes, etc. must be stored in student lockers.
- Any questionable clothing will be referred to administration.

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


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## Homework Club

# School Reminders

## REMINDER FOR STUDENTS LATE TO CLASS

Students that are late to class (by the time attendance is taken) will be considered tardy.

Students that accrue 3 absences to one class, will earn a 1-hour after school detention the following day regardless of club, sports or other commitments.

Students that incur over three or more absences to the same class will earn two 1-hour after school detentions regardless of club, sports or other commitments.

After a student earns 2 1-hour after school detentions, any further absences will result in an ISS the following day and possibly restorative practices to support being on time.

Any work missed will need to be made up after school during detention.





- ◊ Passes are required for all students in the hallways while classes are in session.
- ◊ Students must sign out of each classroom when using the restrooms during class.
- ◊ No running in the hallways at any time.
- ◊ Students are to travel the hallways in single file
- ◊ There is no cell phone use permitted in the building, including lunch.
- ◊ Students should not line up in classrooms before they travel to the next class or end of the day dismissal.
- ◊ One student out of any class at one time unless approved by a CMS faculty or staff member
- ◊ NO HOODS are to be worn in hallways at any time.
- ◊ Only one student at a time in the restrooms.


