October 11th we will be going to Leo's Coney Island to work on time management, money management, and to be able to effectively communicate when out in the community.



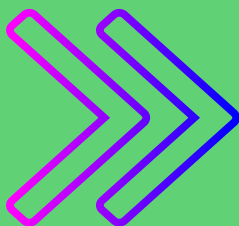

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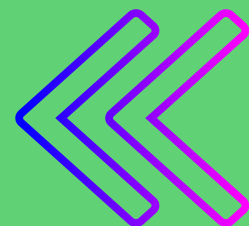

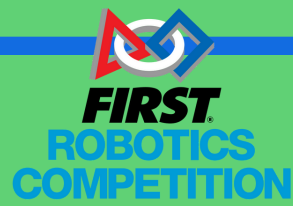
