# **Superintendent's Report and Recommendation:**

- Attendance Report:
  - No Attendance Report for the January Board Meeting. The 5th month of reporting is December 4th January 18th.
- Personnel Report:
  - On a Jackson/Fisher motion, the Board unanimously approved Dr. Holland's personnel recommendations for employment for the 2023-2024 school year and the 2024-2025 school year.

#### - ESPLOST V:

- Director of Finance, Mr. Greg Studdard, presented the ESPLOST V receipts for the tax period of December 2023, which indicate the actual amount collected was \$710,851. The anticipated ESPLOST amount was \$505,300. We had a positive variance of \$205,551.
- Spotlight on Anna K. Davie Elementary School, Principal, Mr. Brant Amerman:
  - Mr. Amerman began his presentation by recognizing the staff members of Anna K. Davie Elementary School and Mrs. Kimmie Whatley, the school's assistant principal. He shared the

school's demographics and highlighted the increase in gifted students and the high retention rate of staff members. The presentation continued with the four pillars. Pillar #1 → Student Achievement - the School Improvement Growth Goals - attendance, reading, and math goals. Pillar #2 → Staff Development - professional learning with the academic coaches - Dr. World and Mrs. Scherich, data analysis meetings, collaborative planning, and the TNTP partnership. Mr. Amerman highlighted two 5th grade teachers with 50%+ growth - Mrs. Garvey and Mrs. McConnel. Pillar #3 → Stakeholder Engagement - family events with student performances and parent workshops, Title I family nights, PTO events, holiday events and luncheons, and parent contacts via SchoolStaus. Pillar #4 → Safety and Operations - the RCS - The AKD Way of being Ready to Learn, Courteous, and Safe. Mr. Amerman highlighted Mr. Bowles for always being RCS and for the fact that 72% of his students scored 50%+ growth. Mr. Amerman concluded with the pictures and highlights indicating that #AKD is the Place to Be.
