Superintendent's Message

Dear USD 251 North Lyon County School Communities,

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all of our junior high and high school students that participated in fall extracurricular activities. Students benefit from extracurricular participation in numerous ways including: learning teamwork, cooperation, building positive relationships, time management, persistence, physical fitness, leadership skills, and improved academic performance. According to a study by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS), students who participate in extracurricular activities make higher grades. There is a great deal of literature that report the academic benefits associated with participating in extracurricular activities. Numerous studies draw the following conclusions:

- Participants have significantly higher GPA's
- Participants have significantly lower absenteeism
- Participants have higher graduation rates
- Participants have higher scores on standardized assessments
- Extra curricular sports decrease health problems

I would like to particularly congratulate the Northern Heights High School girls and boys cross country teams for their success throughout the season and at State Cross Country.

Our school district was recently contacted by the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE) congratulating USD 251 for exceptional work in the following areas:

Kansans Can Star Award – Graduation (Gold), 100% graduation rate

Kansans Can Star Award - Civic Engagement (Bronze)

Congratulations to all of our students, teachers, staff, and administration that contributed to making these awards possible!

Some additional good news for USD 251 are our most recent Kansas Assessment scores from the spring of 2023. The percentage of our district students performing at grade level or above in English Language Arts (ELA) increased by a combined 10.14 percent compared to the statewide increase of 1.29 percent and Math increased by 3.85 percent compared to the statewide increase of 1.14 percent. The five year average trend indicates that the percentage of USD 251 students performing at grade level or above have outperformed the Kansas average by 4.82% in ELA, 9.13% in Science, and 0.29% in Math. On the 2023 assessments, the following classes performed at or above the combined state median scores:

Grade 3 ELA: 2 points above the state median Grade 6 ELA: 3 points above the state median Grade 8 ELA: 10 points above the state median Grade 6 Math: 3 points above the state median Grade 8 Math: even with the state median Grade 10 Math: 3 points above the state median Grade 8 Science: 17 points above the state median Grade 11 Science: 2 points above the state median

Congratulations to all USD 251 teachers, staff, and students for all of their efforts on the Kansas Assessments.
