

# DISTRICT CODE OF CONDUCT, POLICIES, NOTICES AND DISCLOSURES

#### **Summary of Attica Central School District Code of Conduct**

The Board of Education is committed to providing a safe and orderly school environment where students may receive and district personnel may deliver quality educational services without disruption or interference. Responsible behavior by students, teachers, other district personnel, parents, and other visitors is essential to achieving this goal.

The District has a long-standing set of expectations for conduct on school property and at school functions. These expectations are based on the principles of civility, mutual respect, citizenship, character, tolerance, honesty, and integrity.

The Board recognizes the need to clearly define these expectations for acceptable conduct on school property, to identify the possible consequences of unacceptable conduct, and to ensure that discipline, when necessary, is administered promptly and fairly. To this end, the Board has adopted a Code of Conduct.

This code applies to all students, school personnel, parents, and other visitors when on school property or attending a school function. The code's full text can be found online at www.Atticacsd.org/.

#### **Cell Phone Policy**

In accordance with New York State's new "District-Free Schools Policy," Attica Central Schools has adopted a districtwide cell phone ban policy which will go into effect at the outset of the 2025-2026 school year.

The ban will cover our students' instructional day:

- PreK-4: 8 a.m. 3 p.m.
- Grades 5-12: 8:20 a.m. 3:10 p.m.

Students in PreK-4 will leave their devices in their backpacks, turned off and stored in their lockers or cubbies.

Students in grades 5-12 may:

- Leave their cell phones at home
- Leave their cell phones in their vehicle if they drive to school
- Lock their turned off cell phones in a school-provided locker

To get important messages to their child(ren), parents or guardians can call the school's main office. Office personnel will relay the message to the student. If the message is personal or private, staff will call the student to the office to speak directly with the

parent or guardian.

#### **Parent Drop-Off**

Door #29 is open to students at 7:45 a.m. students must report to the cafeteria until 8:05 a.m. The High School Main entrance is open to all students at 8:05 a.m. The warning bell rings at 8:18 a.m.

#### Dropping off and picking up students

Parents with automobiles are not to park in front of the middle or high school buildings or in the bus loop while dropping off students or waiting to pick them up. Cars moving in or out of the lot pose a serious threat to our students as they arrive at or depart school each day. Parents who wish to drop off their child should do so in the designated area adjacent to the bus loop.

#### Computer/Network/Internet Policy

In compliance with The Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, the district has adopted and will enforce an Internet safety policy that ensures the use of technology protection measures (i.e., filtering or blocking of access to certain material on the Internet) on all District computers with Internet access. The District will provide for the education of students regarding appropriate online behavior including interacting with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms, and regarding cyberbullying awareness and response. #### **Chromebook Distribution**

Attica Central School District views the use of electronic resources as central to the delivery of its educational program. By providing students a device to use at home, Attica Central School District intends to enable an engaging, collaborative, self-directed, and empowering learning environment. Students are expected to use district technology and network resources responsibly and parents are expected to collaborate with the school district in ensuring their child uses the district issued device in accordance with district policies and guidelines. #### Access to student records

The Attica Central School District is required by law to provide an annual reminder of rights assured to parents of students and eligible students (students who have reached the age of 18) regarding school records. Under the FERPA law, known as the Buckley Amendment, parents and eligible students are guaranteed access to their children's school records. Copies will be made available upon request, for a nominal copying fee. Parents have the right to challenge the content of the school records. The school is required to provide maintenance of confidentiality of all pupil records. Details of the FERPA law are available in the district office.

# Student Photographs, Videos, and/or Sound Records Opt-Out

A parent may withhold permission to have a student photographed, videotaped, and.or audiotaped during school-sponsored activities, learning experiences and/or media events. If you do not want your child to be photographed, videotaped and/or audiotaped, contact your child's building secretary and complete an opt-out form each school year.

Note: This does not include videotaping by security camera in school or on school buses.

Have medication administered during school hours:	Students who need to take medication in school must submit a request signed by a parent or guardian and a note signed by their doctor(s) that includes exact dosage information and directions to the school nurse. Parents must bring the medication in its original container directly to the school nurse. This includes over-the-counter drugs.
Qualify to vote in school election:	You must be a citizen of the United States, 18 years old or older and a district resident for at least 30 days prior to the election.

#### **PESTICIDE NOTICE**

The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- Antimicrobial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- $\bullet$  The application of EPA-designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA-designated exempt materials under 40 CFR 152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.

#### SCHOOL MEALS

We are pleased to inform you that Attica Central School District is participating in New York State's Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2025-2026 school year.
