Student Placement Process

Every year at this time, we begin to hear from some parents who want to request a specific teacher for their child for next year. They want "the best teacher" at the grade level for their child, and they believe they know who that is based on what they've seen and heard.

I have confidence in every teacher at Heritage Elementary and believe we are fortunate to have such a wonderful staff and so many choices for your child at each grade level.

Please understand that student placement is a complex job and one that we do not take lightly. The entire instructional staff spends a tremendous amount of time working to find the best possible classroom placement for all children. Although we appreciate parent input, we do not accept "Parent Request Letters," but instead ask parents to give us input, if you feel the need to do so, by using a "Student Profile Form." The form asks you to share with us your child's academic/social strengths, and any special needs that may be relevant to your child's placement. As a parent, you know your child best and as the instructional leader of Heritage Elementary, I know my staff.

Please keep in mind that a teacher's grade level assignment can change from year to year. Also, please refrain from talking to your child about next year's possible teacher until finding out who it will be in late August. The Student Profile Forms are currently available in the office. All forms need to be returned to the main office and not the current classroom teacher. In order to complete classroom placement in a timely manner, Student Profile Forms will be accepted until Friday, April 19, 2024 at 4:00 P.M. This input will be taken into consideration, along with other criteria, during placement meetings.

What Parents Should Know –

What is the Hearing & Vision Screening Program?

Michigan law (The Public Health Code 368 of 1978) requires Oakland County Health Division (OCHD) to provide no cost hearing and vision screenings to preschool and school-age children.

Screenings occur in most Oakland County public, private, and charter schools, preschools and at Health Division offices. The program is done in three steps over the course of a child's school years:

- Screenings before kindergarten entry
- 2. Screenings in select grades up to 9th grade.
- 3. As needed, medical referrals for children not passing the screening

OCHD Public Health Technicians help identify potential concerns related to a child's ear or eye health. They are not doctors and do not diagnose conditions or prescribe treatment. Technicians complete a Michigan Department of Community Health & Human Services Technician Training Course and receive continuous training.

Why screen children's hearing and vision?

Hearing and vision difficulties can affect school performance, speech and language skills, self-esteem and social development. Regular hearing and vision screenings identify any problems and ensure they are caught early. Screenings are safe and help children get prompt medical care to reduce disease, physical damage to ear/eye and permanent loss of sight or hearing. They also help parents and teachers make accommodations to help children succeed.

How are hearing and vision screenings performed?

Vision: An age appropriate vision screening instrument screens for eye muscle imbalance and clearness of vision. Children with glasses are screened with glasses/contacts on so they are not referred for further medical evaluation uneccesarily. Hearing: A pure tone audiometer is used. Tones are presented through headphones.


Will I be notified if a problem is found during my child's screening?

Yes, you will be notified if your child does not pass the screening, is absent, or the technician is unable to screen your child. A referral letter to follow-up with the appropriate doctor will also be provided. State of Michigan law requires OCHD to request follow-up documentation that a child who has received this referral receives further evaluation by a physician. If a child does not pass a hearing screening, they may be referred to their physician or invited to an OCHD sponsored Otology Clinic. Otology clinics are offered at community sites throughout Oakland County and allow the child to be evaluated by an ENT (ear, nose and throat) physician and audiologist at no charge for further recommendations.

How will I know when my child is screened in school?

Schools are responsible for communicating to parents about when screenings are scheduled. All children are screened unless the school office is notified otherwise by a parent/guardian. Notify the school if your child has an implanted medical device such as a shunt, pacemaker, vagus nerve stimulators for preventing seizures, Baclofen pumps for spinal cord

injuries, etc. Children with implanted medical devices will not be screened for hearing because they may be at risk for unintended changes in device settings. Children with cochlear implants also are not screened in school. If your child has a medically implanted device and you would like a hearing screening, contact your physician for a referral to an audiologist.



Hearing and Vision screening is required by State of Michigan law for kindergarten entry.

What are signs of hearing or vision problems in a child?

Hearing

- · History of ear infections or drainage
- · Wants the television or radio louder
- Complaints of headaches and/or dizziness
- · Chronic congestion, allergies or mouth breathing

Vision

- · Squints, closes one eye, or tilts head to see
- · Droopy eyelids
- · Misunderstands directions or asks to have things repeated · Eye crosses or wanders even if only when child is ill or tired
 - · Holds objects close to the eyes
 - · Redness, frequent tearing, pain, and/or itching in the eyes

If you notice any of the above signs in your child, contact your health care provider or Oakland County Health Division.

STUDENT ABSENCES

If your child will be absent or late, remember to call the attendance line @ (248) 684-8191 to let the office know. Please leave your students name, teacher's name and reason for absence which should include any illness symptoms if your child is sick. Our office staff may contact you if your child is sick. When a student is absent and we do not hear from a parent, we will try to reach you to be sure that the student is safe and accounted for. The attendance line is available after hours, around the clock, so you can leave a message at any time. We thank you for your help in this matter. Also, if your child will be out for an extended time for vacation, etc, we have "prearranged absence" forms in the office that we can send home for you to fill out ahead of time. We will then put the absences in the computer, so as not to call the parent needlessly. * Please always let the office and the teacher know of these absences.

Medications

If you need us to distribute prescription medications or over the counter medicine, you will need to fill out an **Administering Medication** form giving us parental permission to administer the medication and listing any special conditions and side effects. A "Plan of Care" form may need to be filled out, as well, for certain medical conditions.

No medication will be given without a Doctor's signature.

Forms are available in the office and on the HVS website. Go to "For Parents" choose Health and Wellness, Care Plans.

A parent must bring in the medication to be checked in. Students are not to transport medications to or from school. Please call with any questions.




Early Dismissal
