Community and connection are central to who we are. Students, teachers and staff are all part of the OUHSD family. What makes us unique is our deep roots in the Oroville, CA community in Butte County, which is about seventy miles north of Sacramento, and is surrounded by natural beauty and countless opportunities for recreation in both rural and urban environments. The median home price in Oroville is \$320,000 and median rental price is \$1,200/month.

With 2,200 students at two comprehensive high schools, a continuation high school, and a community day school, our district is a close-knit community where every student and employee knows and cares for each other in a safe, nurturing and supportive environment.

WE HAVE A PASSION to ensure that each student will have a goal and be college- and career-ready, so that they are prepared for the workplace and an economically competitive society.

ABOUT OUR SCHOOLS

Our two comprehensive high schools offer a variety of academic, career and extracurricular opportunities to prepare students for post-secondary education and careers after high school.

Oroville High School, founded in 1892, is the oldest high school in the district. The 18-acre campus serves 810 students.

Las Plumas High School was established in 1960 as the second comprehensive high school. The 64-acre campus serves approximately 1,273 students.

Prospect High School is our continuation high school that provides a positive and supportive learning environment, and gives its 90 students the opportunity to gain the knowledge, attitudes and skills necessary to find success in their career, family and life.

Community Day School serves 6 students who need assistance overcoming truancy and behavioral issues, credit deficiency or probation placements.

Oroville Adult Education Career and Technical Center in Butte County offers academic and vocational programs in Oroville and Chico, aiming to graduate responsible citizens with strong skills. They use a rigorous curriculum with community partnerships and a caring environment.

Independent Study The district offers an independent study program for high school students (excluding CDS) who choose to work from home or have medical reasons. They can still join athletics and clubs at their enrolled school.

Adult Transition Center supports 25 students aged 18-22 with disabilities, focusing on independent living, career training, social skills, recreation, and lifelong learning.
