

The nominee must have a special achievement in their area of specialty and/or received honors, awards, or other recognition at a regional, national, or international level occurring after graduation from CRHS.



Nominations can be made by anyone (family, community members, committee members, current or retired faculty and staff). Following an initial nomination, the committee will retain the nomination for five years. After five years, a nominee can be re-nominated.

2022-2023

- 84% of 7th-12th grade students participated in at least one school activity in 2022-2023.
- K-12 gifted services increased 21% from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023.
- 16% of HS students took at least one of **28** college credit courses earning 164 semester hours.
- 32% of students in grades K-8 moved from below-grade level to at- or above- grade level from fall 2022 to spring 2023 on Aimsweb assessments.
- 12 seniors participating in our work-study program worked 4,400 hours during the 2022-23 school year earning more than \$62,000. Work-study participants also earn the Ohio Means Jobs graduation seal

Communication

Ensure transparent communication and promote dialogue within our community.

PERCEPTION SURVEYS The district conducted surveys of our parents/guardians, staff, and 7-12 grade students related to the four focus areas of our strategic plan. Results from the surveys are being used to better communicate offerings and outcomes and in the creation of goals for the 2023-2024 school year.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS RECOGNIZED Student programs were featured in different state-level venues: The Environmental Science Program at the Ohio School Boards Association Student Achievement Fair and CRHS Band at the Ohio Music Education Association State Conference. Three FFA members earned State Degree and two recent alumni were recognized at the national convention with their American Degrees. Our girls soccer team earned academic and sportsmanship/integrity awards from the national coaches' association.

Student Experience

Provide a variety of opportunities for growth inside and outside of the classroom.

THRIVE AND AMAZING SHAKE Students in our middle school focus on life skills, such as communication, during THRIVE. The culminating activity for THRIVE is our Amazing Shake, which brought more than 40 guest judges to Cory-Rawson for the day.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT Career exploration and development begins in the early grades and leads to a commitment that each of our graduates has a plan focused on enrollment, employment, enlistment, and/or entrepreneurship. Partnerships with our Business Advisory Council, community, and alumni allow our students to engage in internships, visits, and work-study.

Income Tax Renewed In May, voters approved a 5-year renewal of our .75% income tax, which is used for operating expenses.

Managing Long-Term Finances The district's cash reserve, or savings, stands at just over \$5 million. The district was able to avoid deficit-spending (higher expenses than revenues) which was projected to start in 2021. One way was by growing our revenue streams including \$310,000 in local and state grants the district was awarded during the 2022-2023 school year.

Facilities Needs: Our high school facilities have been well-maintained, but will need some systems updates in the foreseeable future. The district is investigating energy-savings grant programs and other financing avenues to bring these projects to fruition.





Student Learning

Provide student learning opportunities designed to prepare every student for future success.

DUAL CREDIT OFFERINGS Students can earn both high school and college credit simultaneously through our growing partnership with Rhodes State, which allows students to remain at CRHS for dual credit coursework.

INDUSTRY CREDENTIALS In addition to credentials earned in Millstream Career Tech programming, CRHS students earned industry-recognized credentials in industrial robotics, entrepreneurship, and leadership during the 2022-2023 school year. Students also earned OHSAA officiating credentials in basketball and football.







ATHLETICS HIGHLIGHT REEL

Cory-Rawson student-athletes wrapped up a successful 2022-23 school year last year, capped by several highlights in the spring. The boys and girls track and field programs were both represented at the OHSAA Division III regionals, narrowly missing out on multiple state track bids. Softball, girls track and field, girls basketball, and girls and boys soccer all saw new records set in 2022-23. Multiple student-athletes garnered recognition across the area in several sports, led by an All-Ohio girls basketball season from Paige McVetta. In its last season in the BVC, Cory-Rawson athletics left a lasting impression as it heads to the Northwest Central Conference for a new challenge.
