## A. 2022-2023 Staffing and Enrollment

• Currently have 701 students enrolled. Projected 705. Currently short one SpEd parapro, but well-staffed otherwise. Focusing on the 2023-2024 school year.

## **B.** Facilities Update

- Company to install canopies in front of the school will be coming tomorrow for a site visit and staking. Could be completed in the next two weeks, a 2-day job. Mr. Graff hoping that they can come and start a Saturday and then install on a Monday.
- Mr. Carruth and Board members took a tour of the playground and the area Sycamore would like to have tiered for usability and erosion control. Still on-going. Hoping that the School Facility Board would be footing most of the bill when we can move forward.
- No longer plan to have CFMS use the Sycamore field for their football/soccer practice and games. They would only use it for softball.
- Exterior 8ft fencing project complete! Considering putting up a sign requiring parents to go through the office when leaving campus during school hours (instead of through the crash

bar gates). Also looking into keypads (\$20k each) for the AfterCare/Preschool parents so they can get through the gates to pick up their kids.

### IV. New Business

# A. 2023-2024 Staffing and Enrollment

The current projection for January 2024 is 682 students. With current numbers of incoming Kindergarteners and remaining students, only 10 students shy of projection. Open enrollment is available for K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade (4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> are already full or over capacity). Plan to have 4 sections of 1<sup>st</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grades and 5 sections of Kinder, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> grades.

- Still looking for PE and Music teachers; will likely be looking at non-certified candidates who would work on certification while teaching.
- Ms. Trejo (Resource) will be moved to Inclusion next year with Rene Frejoles and will be looking for a replacement for Resource to work with Ms. Roell.
- Still waiting to hear whether the state will accept the grant for a counselor. If it works out, will look to hire a social worker.
- The district increased the Maintenance & Operations budget by 8% to account for inflation.

## **B.** Campus Safety

Mr. Graff reported on the 8ft exterior fencing project during his facilities report. [Please see the 4<sup>th</sup> bullet under III.B above for details.]

This will remain on the agenda as a running item.

### **C. 301 Goals**

Mr. Graff reported that all 301 goals were met this year!

- 100% of the teachers submitted their lesson plans, etc. for their Beyond Textbooks goal.
- The test score goal was also met, with the students hitting an average of 77% in math and 83% in ELA (target was 75% or better).
- Kindergarteners hit 89% of their sight words/photograms/numbers to 100 goal.

Mr. Hancock moved to accept. Ms. Shioya seconded. Mr. Hecht signed the form as Chair of the Council.
