## Youth Mental Health

We wanted to share important information with you regarding the well-being of our adolescents aged 11-18 in Woodford County. Recently, area health departments sent information to school districts about an increase in suicide attempts among this age group, with many of these attempts involving the use of prescription or over-the-counter medications.

At MGS, we are committed to the safety and well-being of our students, and we want to provide you with resources to support prevention efforts, address mental health concerns, and prevent substance misuse among teens. #### Safe2Help Illinois

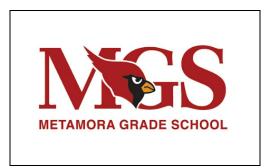
Last school year, our school district began participating in a statewide school safety program called Safe2Help Illinois. This program offers students a safe and confidential way to share information that may help prevent suicides, bullying, school violence, and other threats to student safety. The program also includes resources for educators and parents to reinforce the program concepts with their students.

Safe2Help Illinois features a 24/7 helpline (1-844-4-SAFEIL), free mobile app, and dedicated website (www.Safe2Helpil.com). In the absence of a trusted adult, students can use Safe2Help Illinois to share concerns about themselves or others in a confidential environment. Once vetted, the information will be immediately shared with local school officials, 911 call centers/Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) depending on the nature of the tip. It is important to note that this program is not intended to punish, suspend or expel students. Rather, the intent is to encourage students to "seek help before harm."

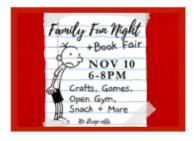

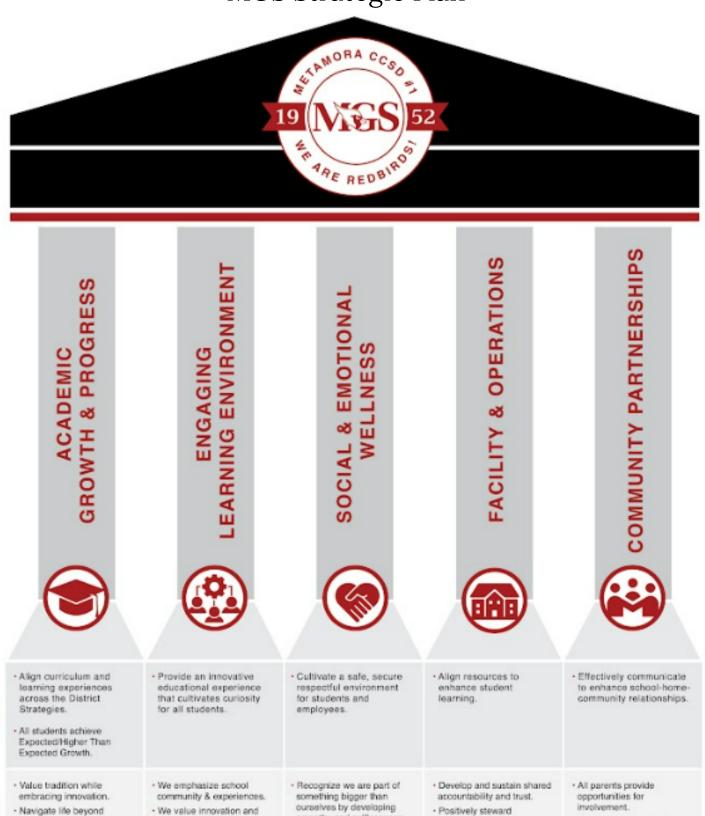
