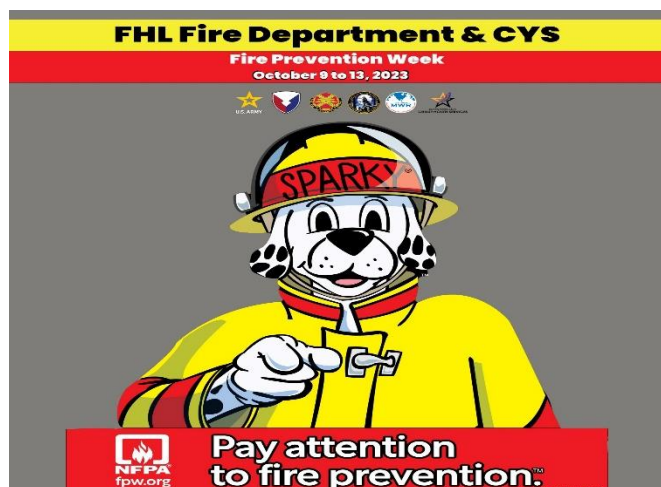

Halloween Parade / Party

The Halloween Parade will be held on Tuesday, October 31. The parade will begin at 1:45 weather permitted. Your child may wear their school appropriate costume to school or bring it in a bag labeled with your child's name to put on before the parade. Please be sure not to send any make-up or toy weapons with your child's costume. Please do not send any candy or edible items. Pencils, crayons, stickers, or books are permitted. Please limit face paint.



October is Fire Prevention Month. During the week of October 9-13, Allison Elementary School will recognize Fire Prevention. To make sure your child has the skills that can potentially save his/her life, we will be teaching burn prevention and fire safety. A key element of this learning process will include a tour at school of the Fire Safety House and a ride around the block in a fire truck. This year's theme is to pay attention to fire prevention and reinforce the critical importance of developing a home escape plan with all members of the household and practice it regularly. Hancock County School's attendance theme is "9 or Less = Success"

Each nine weeks, students who are on target to meet the county goal will receive a special treat during our nine week reward day.

Per Hancock County School Attendance Policy and in collaboration with WVDE, students are allowed ten (10) parental excused days each year. These are days where a visit to the doctor is not necessary, but the child is ill or absent for another medical reason. If your child is absent more than ten (10) parental excused days, all further absences will be considered unexcused unless a doctor's note is provided. Educational Vacation Request forms are available upon request.
