Dear Pinewood Families,

Happy New Year! I hope this newsletter finds you well and ready for an exciting and productive year ahead. As we kick off 2024, we reflect on the achievements of the past year and look forward to the many opportunities and experiences awaiting our students in the months to come.

Assessments serve as valuable tools to gauge student understanding and progress, providing insights into areas of strength and areas that may require additional support. It's crucial for students to view assessments not only as evaluative measures but also as opportunities for growth and learning. Meanwhile, the significance of good rest cannot be overstated. Quality sleep plays a pivotal role in cognitive function, memory consolidation, and overall well-being. All Pinewood students are taking reading and math assessments in the next few weeks. This information will be shared with families, at the end of the month, on report cards and progress notes. One of the coolest things about being a teacher is watching kids grow both physically and academically. Here at Pinewood we want to celebrate all the growth and learning that your kiddos have done so far.

We made some big shifts in our lunch schedule, allowing for longer times at the table. We also restructured the seating arrangement. All of this has increased time for eating and reduced the mess and organized chaos.

Winter in the PNW is wet and often cold. Most days we have outdoor recess, even if it is raining. The only exceptions are extreme high/cold temperatures (above 100 or below freezing), lightning, and sideways rain. Our healthroom does not have changes of clothes for all of our students. Please have your student dress for the weather.

Esta información se compartirá con las familias, al final del mes, en boletas de calificaciones y notas de progreso. Una de las cosas más interesantes de ser profesor es ver a los niños crecer tanto física como académicamente. Aquí en Pinewood queremos celebrar todo el crecimiento y aprendizaje que sus hijos han hecho hasta ahora.

Hicimos algunos cambios importantes en nuestro horario de almuerzo, lo que permitió pasar más tiempo en la mesa. También reestructuramos la disposición de los asientos. Todo esto ha aumentado el tiempo para comer y reducir el desorden y el caos organizado.

El invierno en el noroeste de Washington es húmedo y, a menudo, frío. La mayoría de los días tenemos recreo al aire libre, incluso si está lloviendo. Las únicas excepciones son las temperaturas extremadamente altas o frías (por encima de 100 o bajo cero), relámpagos y lluvia lateral. Family Access in Skyward(<http://family.marysville.wa-k12.net>)

Family Access is a great way for parents and guardians to access your child's grades, view attendance, discipline, meal account activity, and update your personal information such as phone numbers or emergency contacts. In some cases, the district will post forms in Family Access that require viewing and/or a signature. Family Access is part of our student data system. Each account is private and viewable only to those who have approved credentials and a login and password. For the protection of our students, this cannot be done over the phone

Setting up a Family Access Account:In order to set up an account for Family Access, you will need to have an email in your child(rens) records in the data system. This is typically added when you enrolled your child(ren) in school but can become outdated over time. Follow these steps to get connected:

If you have not provided an email, please contact your child(rens) school office and provide them with parent/guardian email addresses.

If you have an email but do not have your login information or you need to create an account, go to <https://www.ms25.org/o/district/page/skyward-family-access--38> choose Family/Student login under the resource column.

Click on the "forgot username or password" link and follow the steps.

You can also connect to the Family Access App once you have an established account. Search "Family Access" on your smart phone App store.

ABSENCES and TARDIES

Please call the ATTENDANCE LINE at 360.965.1301

If your student will be absent or late arriving to school for any reason, please call the attendance line. If not answered this line goes directly to voice mail, which makes it available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. When you know in advance that your child has a medical or dental appointment that will keep them out of school or arrive to school late, leave a message at this line. We are able to take the information in advance. If you do not leave a message and your child is not at school, an automated call will go out to attempt contacting you to ensure that your child is safe. Your child will be marked unexcused if contact is not made..

Please help us by calling in by 9:00 am. When your child is absent, please call or send a note with your child to excuse the absence within 3 days. Pre-arranged absences for family reasons need prior approval by the principal, provided that the absence will not adversely affect your child's progress in school. Absence approval forms are available in the school office. If your child arrives at 9:25 or later, please check in at the office for a tardy slip to minimize disturbance in the classroom.

How Does Your Child Go Home?

There may be days when your child is uncertain of the manner by which they are expected to leave school. days a child may be picked up by a parent or other adult and other days they may ride the bus or walk. This may cause some confusion especially as we see the change of weather . Please help your child know in advance what is expected of them at the end of the school day. It may be a good idea to create a plan with your child, reinforcing each morning how they are to get home. Of course, emergencies do happen. When the plan changes during the day, the office is happy to send a parent message to the student by 3:00 PM. Our goal is to ensure that your child returns home safely and as quickly as possible.

We are receiving many messages for students concerning end of the day plans. In order to avoid interruption of instructional time, we ask that plans for after school be discussed before school each day. Please keep end of the day messages for emergency changes only!
