



# **ATTENDANCE**



Under state law (RCW 28A.225), students are required to attend school full-time, without unexcused absences, skips or tardies. It is important that you understand our school policies and procedures, as well as Washington State Law, to ensure your child is successful in school. State law for mandatory attendance, called the Becca Bill, requires children from ages 8 to 18 to attend a public school, private school, or a district-approved home school program.

### **What is needed from Parents/Guardians:**

#### Communication:

### Unexcused: Seven (7) Days in a month or fifteen (15) in a school year:

Unexcused: After seven (7) days of unexcused absences in any month (one day consists of more than half a school day) or fifteen (15) days of unexcused absences in a school year, an intervention meeting and/or community engagement board meeting may take place along with a Becca petition being filed with juvenile court if needed.

### Excused: Fifteen (15) fifteen days excused in a year

Excused: When the student accumulates fifteen (15) days of excused absences in a year, documentation from a Licensed Health Care Practitioner (LHP) will be required to excuse future absences due to illness/medical condition. Without documentation, the absence will be considered unexcused.

### Withdrawal: Twenty (20) consecutive absences

Withdrawal: Withdrawal from school will occur after twenty (20) consecutive days of absence. If the school secretary or registrar does not receive a request for records within ten (10) days of withdrawal from school, a re-engagement letter or phone call will be made to determine the best course of action in order to avoid juvenile court proceedings

#### **Excused absence criteria**

- Absences due to illness, health condition, family emergency or religious purposes
- Court, judicial proceeding, court-ordered activity, or jury service
- Post-secondary, technical school or apprenticeship program visitation, or scholarship interview
- State-recognized search and rescue activities consistent with RCW 28A.225.055
- Absence directly related to the student's homeless or foster care/dependency status
- Absences related to deployment activities of a parent or legal guardian who is an active duty member consistent with RCW 28A.705.010
- Absences due to suspensions, expulsions or emergency expulsions
- Absences due to student safety concerns, including absences related to threats, assaults, or bullying
- Absences due to a student's migrant status
- An approved activity that is consistent with district policy and is mutually agreed upon by the principal or designee and a parent, guardian, or emancipated youth. \*Up to 5 days per school year.

### **TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL**

We coordinate with the Snohomish Health District in protecting children from certain symptoms of communicable diseases. If your child has any of these symptoms, please keep him/her home, or make appropriate child care arrangements.

APPEARANCE, BEHAVIOR – unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, difficult to wake, or irritable.

This is sufficient reason to keep a child home from school.

EYES - red with thick green or yellow drainage may indicate a bacterial conjunctivitis.

FEVER – child should remain home with TEMPERATURE OF 100 DEGREES Fahrenheit or higher. Children must be fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medicine. Greenish nose discharge, and/or chronic cough – should be seen by a health care provider.

SORE THROAT – especially with fever or rash. Children with possible strep throat should be seen by their provider.

DIARRHEA – watery stools in the past 24 hour period especially if the child acts or looks ill.

**VOMITING** – within the past 24 hours.

RASH - body rash, especially with fever or itching.

EAR PAIN – students with drainage/pain/fever need to be seen by a healthcare provider. Students do not need to be excluded unless discomfort interrupts the learning process.

Untreated ear infections can cause permanent hearing loss.

LICE - If your child has head lice please contact your health room to discuss treatment.

SCABIES – children with scabies may be admitted back to school 24 hours after treatment begins.

ANTIBIOTICS – if your child has an illness that requires antibiotics, please check with your provider as to when the child may return to school.

COVID19-LIKE SYMPTOMS – cough, runny nose, fever, headache, congestion, sore throat, diarrhea and vomiting.

Bringing a child to school with the above symptoms puts other children and staff at risk of getting sick. While we regret any inconvenience this may cause, in the long run this means fewer lost workdays and less illness fo

#### DEMASIADO ENFERMO PARA LA ESCUELA

Coordinamos con el Departamento de Salud de Snohomish para proteger a los niños de ciertos síntomas de enfermedades transmisibles. Si su hijo tiene alguno de estos síntomas, manténgalo en casa o haga arreglos adecuados para su cuidado fuera de escuela.

APARIENCIA, COMPORTAMIENTO – inusualmente cansado, pálido, falta de apetito, difícil de despertar o irritable. Esta es razón suficiente para mantener a un niño en casa y sin ir a la escuela.

OJOS – el color rojo con una secrecion espesa de color verde o amarillo puede indicar una conjuntivitis bacteriana.

FIEBRE – el niño debe permanecer en casa con una TEMPERATURA DE 100 GRADOS fahrenheit (100°F / 37.78 °C o más. El niño no debe tener fiebre durante 24 horas sin tomar medicamentos para reducir la fiebre. Secreción nasal verdosa y/o tos crónica: debe consultar a un proveedor de atención médica.

DOLOR DE GARGANTA – especialmente con fiebre o sarpullido. Los niños con posible faringitis estreptocócica deben ser atendidos por su proveedor médico.

DIARREA – heces acuosas (desechos sueltos) en las últimas 24 horas, especialmente si el niño actúa o parece enfermo.

VÓMITO – en las últimas 24 horas.

ERUPCION (RONCHAS) – erupcion corporal, especialmente con fiebre o picazón.

DOLOR DE OÍDO – los estudiantes con drenaje/dolor/fiebre deben ser atendidos por un proveedor de atención médica. No es necesario excluir al estudiante a menos que una incomodidad interrumpa el proceso de aprendizaje. Las infecciones de oído no tratadas pueden causar pérdida auditiva permanente.

PIOJOS - si su hijo tiene piojos, comuníquese con su sala de salud para discutir el tratamiento.

SARNA – los niños con sarna pueden regresar a la escuela 24 horas después de que comience el tratamiento.


ANTIBIÓTICOS – si su hijo tiene una enfermedad que requiere antibióticos, consulte con su proveedor médico para indicación de cuando pueda regresar a la escuela.

SÍNTOMAS SIMILARES AL COVID19 – tos, secreción nasal, fiebre, dolor de cabeza, congestión, dolor de garganta, diarrea y vómitos.

Llevar a un niño a la escuela con los síntomas anteriores pone a otros niños y al personal en riesgo de enfermarse. Si bien lamentamos cualquier inconveniente que esto pueda causar, a largo plazo esto significa menos días laborales perdidos y menos enfermedades también para los padres.
